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INTRODUCTION

I. OVERVIEW OF DISABILITY LAW

A. HISTORY OF LAWS

Protection under the law for the non-discrimination of persons with disabilities has been evolving for more than two decades. The first significant national law was the 1968 Architectural Barriers Act which required that all new federally constructed, leased or financed buildings be accessible to and usable by persons with physical disabilities.

The Rehabilitation Act of 1973 requires under Section 504 that recipients of federal funds make their programs and activities accessible to persons with disabilities. “No otherwise qualified individual with handicaps in the United States...shall, solely by reason of his/her handicap, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance...” In 1990, Congress passed the Americans with Disabilities Act which extends Section 504’s non-discrimination mandate to all activities of State and local governments, not only those that receive Federal financial assistance. Effective January 26, 1992, the ADA builds upon many of the concepts and terms established by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and it is the most comprehensive disability law in the world.

The ADA not only extends the law, it also reflects society’s evolving, more positive attitude toward persons with disabilities by changing the language of disability. “Individual with disability” is now the preferred term, instead of “handicapped individual”. Most importantly, the ADA focuses on the person and not the disability and prohibits discrimination against a “qualified individual with a disability”.

With the recent enactment of the ADA, the City of Boston now has a broader responsibility for providing persons with disabilities with an equally effective opportunity to participate in or benefit from the City’s services, activities, and programs.

B. KEY CONCEPTS

There are several important concepts which form the underlying principles of accessibility under Title II of the ADA and Section 504 of the 1973 Rehabilitation Act. These include “program accessibility”, “effective communication”, and “integrated setting”.

PROGRAM ACCESSIBILITY. Section 504 and Title II prohibit discrimination in any “program activity” provided by a governmental entity. The “program or activity”, when viewed in its entirety, must be readily accessible to and usable by individuals with disabilities. For example, a program may be offered in several different facilities but not all of the facilities must be fully accessible as long as the accessible buildings are in locations comparable in convenience to those available to other participants. Program

accessibility may be achieved through a variety of different methods including alterations of existing facilities, acquisition or new construction of additional facilities, relocation of programs to accessible sites, acquisition or redesign of equipment, and assignment of aids to beneficiaries.

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION Title II requires the City of Boston to provide effective means of communication to persons with vision, hearing, speech and cognitive disabilities. Communications with individuals with disabilities must be provided to the extent necessary to enable persons with disabilities to participate in and enjoy the benefit of the city's services, programs, and activities on an equal basis with all other persons. In order to provide equal access, a municipality must make available appropriate auxiliary aids and services where necessary to ensure effective communication. These auxiliary aids and services may include qualified interpreters, written materials, telecommunications devices for deaf persons (TDDs), taped texts, large print materials, telephone relay services, etc.

INTEGRATED SETTING A primary goal of the ADA is the equal participation of individuals with disabilities in the "mainstream" of American society. Individuals with disabilities must be integrated to the maximum extent appropriate; cannot be excluded from regular programs; or be required to accept special service or benefits if they are offered to ensure equal opportunity.

All actions to achieve program accessibility, effective communication, and integrated settings must be undertaken unless to do so would result in a fundamental alteration to the program or activity or in an undue financial or administrative burden.

C. HIGHLIGHTS OF REQUIREMENTS

Under Title II, the City of Boston must take several steps designed to achieve compliance, including development of a grievance procedure, designation of an individual to oversee Title II compliance, development of a transition plan if physical alterations are necessary to achieve program accessibility, and the completion of a self-evaluation. Boston currently has a grievance procedure in place and the Director for Civil Rights, of the Commission for Persons with Disabilities, is the appointed compliance coordinator. The Self-Evaluation, which is the City's assessment of its current policies and procedures to ensure that there are no impediments to the full participation of individuals with disabilities in its programs and activities, must be completed by January 26, 1993. The Commission for Persons with Disabilities is responsible for assisting Boston's various departments in the preparation of their individual assessments.

Where structural modifications, or physical alterations, are required to achieve program accessibility, a public entity with 50 or more employees must prepare a transition

plan by July 26, 1992 that identifies barriers to be removed. The modifications must be completed as soon as possible but no later than July 26, 1995. This document represents Boston's Transition Plan. It has been prepared by the Public Facilities Department, in cooperation with the Office of Civil rights, and is available for public review.

ADA Title II enforcement starts with filing an internal complaint with the Commission for Persons with Disabilities and can go on to include filing an administrative complaint with the appropriate Federal agency (e.g. any complaints related to discrimination within the School Department are referred to the Department of Education) or filing a lawsuit in Federal district court. Administrative complaints are investigated by the appropriate Federal agency and every effort is made to negotiate a settlement with the public entity to remedy any identified violations. If no settlement can be reached, the matter is referred to the Department of Justice for a decision whether to institute litigation. Penalties for discrimination can include monetary fines and the recovery of legal fees by the prevailing, or successful party. In cases where there is Federal funding, fund termination is an enforcement option.

II. ACCESSIBILITY AND THE CITY OF BOSTON

A.HISTORY OF ACCESSIBILITY IN BOSTON

The Commission on Handicapped Affairs of the City of Boston was established in 1971 to address the needs, issues, and concerns of the handicapped community. Originally, the 8-member Commission met monthly with a member of the Mayor's staff to discuss and recommend changes in the structure or programs of city departments to ensure that those departments or programs were accessible to persons with disabilities. In 1979, in response to complaints of limited handicapped access to Boston's downtown developments and in an effort to extend the scope of services it could provide, the Commission was funded for the first time. These funds added paid staff to help facilitate change within the city departments and to provide a direct link between the handicapped individual and city services. The four basic services provided by the Commission included information and referral, casework, advocacy, and lobbying. In 1982, the Commissioner of Handicapped Affairs was designated the City's 504 Compliance Officer.

In 1987, a City of Boston Ordinance created the Commission for Persons with Disabilities "to facilitate full and equal participation in all aspects of life by all persons with disabilities" by reducing the architectural, procedural, attitudinal, and communication barriers which affect persons with disabilities. The board, or Commission, consists of a paid Commissioner and eleven associate members, the majority of who must be persons with disabilities. The Commissioner is charged with hiring staff, including a Director for Civil Rights who is also the City's 504 Coordinator. One of the specific responsibilities of the Commission is the coordination of City departmental compliance with Section 504 and

all federal, state, and city rules and regulations requiring programs, activities, and services to be readily accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities. Each department head designates a liaison to the Commission to coordinate and monitor compliance with applicable laws.

B. CAPITAL PLANNING RESPONSIBILITIES

The Public Facilities Department is responsible for developing and implementing the City of Boston's comprehensive capital improvements program. Since 1985 the Office of Capital Planning, now a part of the Public Facilities Department, has prepared an annual capital budget in support of the 1.13 billion *Rebuilding Boston* plan for investing in the City's infrastructure, neighborhoods, and economic development. During this time period more than 850 revitalizations projects have been completed or initiated. According to the most recent Capital Plan, over \$500 million of improvements will be initiated between 1992 and 1996.

All of Boston's new municipal facilities, including the New City Hospital under construction and the Boston Police Headquarters Building, currently in design, meet all applicable regulations and standards for handicapped accessibility. In addition, all existing facilities undergoing substantial renovation, such as Boston Latin Academy, are made fully accessible. Unfortunately, the majorities of Boston's municipal buildings were built prior to the enactment of federal and state access rules and regulations and therefore have many barriers to accessibility. Access improvements throughout these more than 350 existing municipal buildings have been, and continue to be, an important City priority. In 1989 the **Boston Municipal Access Study** identified physical barriers in 130 municipal facilities. This information is now being used in the planning of current and future capital improvements. A detailed survey of all of Boston's 121 school facilities is scheduled for 1992 to guide the capital investment strategy of the future.

COMMUNITY CENTERS

COMMUNITY CENTERS: SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

Boston Community Centers runs a wide range of educational, recreational, social, and human services programs for residents of Boston. It operates from forty five facilities.

Taken as a whole, Community Centers programs are accessible. Although some programs are located at inaccessible locations, another nearby program exists which is accessible. Only in one case, a bowling program for youngsters in east Boston, did we find a unique program held at an inaccessible location.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

Accessible: No barriers to the entrance of the building, to all floors of the building, and to toilets.

Partially Accessible: Some barriers exist; usually, this term means at least the main floor of the building is accessible. It may or may not include access to toilets or to secondary floors.

Not Accessible: No access to the building or its functions.

PROGRAMS

Community Centers run a wide range of programs for all residents of Boston. For purposes of this transition plan, we have separated these programs into the following categories:

Athletic Programs
Child Care Programs
Educational Programs
Miscellaneous
Recreational Programs
Senior Citizen programs
Youth Programs

The attached program matrixes breakdown the programs in more detail.

CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS- - NOT INCLUDING SWIMMING POOLS

All facilities, with the exception of the following, are accessible. Pools, which are generally part of larger facilities, are dealt with separately in the next section.

Central Park Lanes: not accessible (one program runs form here)

Harborside Maverick Program: not accessible; programs duplicate in other east Boston locations.

Harborside Orient Heights Program: not accessible; programs duplicated in other East Boston locations.

Harborside Salesians Program: not accessible, programs duplicated in East Boston locations.

Paris Street Recreation Center: fully accessible on the first floor; not accessible to the second or third floor.

Nazarro Center: The first floor is accessible. The second and third floors are not accessible.

L Street/Curley Recreation Center: Almost all spaces are fully accessible and compliant. The solariums, (one for men, one for women), are not accessible. Other similar space exists inside and outside of the building.

Tynan School: No accessible toilets.

City Roots at Uphams Corner Muni: not accessible. This program is duplicated in other accessible locations.

Murphy School: No accessible toilets.

City Roots at Roslindale: partially accessible. This program is duplicated at other accessible locations.

CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS- - SWIMMING POOLS

Community Center runs eighteen swimming pools. Thirteen are located in schools, 3 are located in stand alone swimming pool buildings operated year round, and two are outside pools, with locker rooms buildings, operated only in the summer.

All of the pools in schools have access problems, although all can be reached by a person in a wheelchair. Of these thirteen pools, ten will undergo renovation through a 91/92 capital grant and all ten will receive access improvements to correct outstanding problems, including the addition of pool lifts.

Of the three stand alone pool, two are completely accessible and code compliant. The Mason pool requires the addition of a pool lift.

Of the two outdoor pools, both have pool lifts and are accessible; however, the Mirabella Pool locker room areas are not accessible. A recent architectural review found it to be infeasible to add lifts or other barrier removal structures to this building.

CURRENTLY FUNDED ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS

Access improvements are scheduled for 10 of the swimming pools located in school buildings to make them fully accessible.

In addition, funds were allocated in the FY92 Capital Plan to study access solutions at the Paris Street Gym.

PRIORITIES

Priorities for the vertical access will be the Paris Street Gym, Uphams Corner Municipal (noted under Real Property as well), and the Nazarro Center. Priorities for programmatic changes will be the Central Park Lanes program.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

FIRE DEPARTMENT: SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

DEFINITIONS

As it is used in this document, access does not necessarily imply full code compliance. Although some buildings may be fully code compliant, the terms as they are used here have the following definitions:

*Accessible: Access to all floors and accessible toilets.

*Partially accessible: Accessible to at least one floor and may or may not include accessible toilets.

*Inaccessible: No access to the building.

All of these facilities are owned by the City of Boston and managed and maintained by the Fire Department.

PROGRAMS

The primary programs of the Fire Department do not involve the public. However a few do:

*Educational programs at fire stations: this includes such items as tours and talks by firefighters to groups of children, etc.

*Arson: the public is required to submit reports at the Arson building on car fires.

*Headquarters: the public may from time to time have business to conduct at the headquarters building, such as filing applications for employment.

*Training: from time to time, seminars are held for insurance representatives at the Fire Department's training site at Moon Island.

CURRENTLY FUNDED ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS

Fire Stations

*All fire stations are accessible to the main vehicle level. Those with second floors are not accessible to the second floor (used only as private quarters/not public spaces); most fire stations do not include accessible bathrooms.

Administrative Buildings

*Headquarters: currently in construction to be made accessible. *Arson Building; accessible on the first floor, no accessible toilets

*Alarm Building: accessible on the first floor, no accessible toilets

Maintenance Buildings

*Maintenance Building: accessible, no accessible toilets {this building used for vehicle maintenance and maintenance staff offices only}

*High Pressure Station: accessible, no accessible toilets (this building houses high pressure pumps; it is not occupied except during service visits)

Miscellaneous Buildings

*Marine Unit - accessible

*Training Facility - accessible to the first floor, no accessible toilets.

CURRENTLY FUNDED ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS

Under construction — Fire Department Headquarters improvements including access.

PRIORITIES

In general, the Fire Department is not a priority for access improvements because all of its public programs are currently accessible. Future capital plans will consider the following to improve access to employees and the public:

*Arson building and Alarm building: provision of accessible toilets

*Training Facility: provision of accessible toilets *Maintenance Building: provision of accessible toilets

PROGRAM ALTERNATIVES PRIOR TO STRUCTURAL CHANGES

In the event that access is required to a class at the Moon Island training facility it will be held on the first floor or at another, accessible location.

HEALTH & HOSPITALS

HEALTH & HOSPITALS: SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

Boston's Health and Hospitals provide a wide range of health services to Boston's residents. Its largest single operation is Boston City Hospital, a full service inpatient and outpatient facility. Other programs include the Mattapan Chronic Care Hospital, two homeless shelters, public health nursing programs, research laboratories. City morgue and autopsies, and many other related programs.

FACILITIES

Hospital programs are run at three primary sites: the Long Island Campus, the Boston City Hospital Campus in the South End (which also includes the South Block residential and recreational facilities), and the Mattapan campus on River Street.

At the Boston City Hospital Campus, a new inpatient facility is currently under construction to take the place of several current inpatient buildings. All inpatient services, the emergency room, and other services will be consolidated into this building starting in late 1994 and this building will be completely code compliant. Following the completion of construction, other buildings on the campus will be demolished and all patient care facilities (including the Ambulatory Care Center) will be completely accessible, and for the main part, code compliant.

The South Block area of the BCH campus has been considered separately in this document as it is managed separately and has different functions. This complex consists of two residential buildings, one parking garage, and a recreational facility (gym, auditorium, swimming pool, etc.).

The Mattapan campus consists of a number of buildings, the largest of which, the Foley Building, houses the Hospital's Chronic Care facility. This building has undergone massive renovations over the last several years, and when complete, will be fully accessible. The remaining buildings at Mattapan house maintenance and office functions, or programs run by non-city agencies, with the exception of the Police Stress Unit which is operated by the Boston Police Department and is not accessible. Finally, a new home for Children with Aids is under construction and will be operated by Health and Hospitals; this building will be completely code compliant.

The primary care building at Long Island, the Nichols Building, was recently closed. The only city program remaining at this campus is the Homeless Shelter; other buildings house non-city programs or maintenance functions.

In addition to these primary sites, Health and Hospitals staff have offices in rental space at **1010** Massachusetts Avenue; these offices are totally accessible.

Finally, Health and Hospitals is responsible for six health centers. One of these, Hyde Park, is used only as offices for Public Health Nurses; the remainders are active health centers.

PROGRAMS/CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS/PRIORITIES

Because of the enormous complexity of Health and Hospitals programs, we have not attempted to break down all of the programs as we have for most other Departments. The following charts describe building uses, access levels, and priorities by campus. Except for buildings currently in construction, no funding is currently allocated for handicap access improvements.

Priorities for access mainly include bathrooms in otherwise accessible buildings. All are secondary priorities in the overall plan, because the buildings are either generally not public, or in the case of the Long Island shelter, has a program that is provided in another, accessible location.

HISTORICAL BUILDINGS

HISTORICAL BUILDINGS SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

Although the City owns numerous buildings of historical significance, four have been included in this category as the primary feature of these buildings is their historical value.

FACILITIES

*Dillaway Thomas House, Roxbury is owned by the City of Boston but operated by the Massachusetts Parks Department

*Faneuil Hall, Downtown is owned and operated by the City's Real Property Department

*Old State House, Downtown is owned by the City but operated by the National Parks Service

*Abiel Smith School, Beacon Hill is owned by the City but operated by the National Parks Service

PROGRAMS

The City operates programs out of only one of the buildings above, Faneuil Hall. These programs are: tours, public meetings, and rental of commercial space.

CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS

Two recent capital improvement projects - - Dillaway Thomas House, funded by the State, and administered by the City's Public Facilities Department, and the Old State House/Faneuil Hall restoration project funded and administered by the National Parks Service in cooperation with the City, have brought these three buildings into full compliance with access codes, despite the architectural difficulties presented in merging access with maintaining historical integrity.

The Abiel Smith School is not accessible. However, the City runs no programs at this site.

PRIORITIES

Since the City runs no programs which are inaccessible in any of these buildings, there are no priorities.

LIBRARY DEPARTMENT

LIBRARIES SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

Taken together, the main programs — lending of reading and audiovisual materials and reference assistance — of the Boston Public Library system are accessible. Only five libraries, of the total of 27 library buildings, are inaccessible, and in every case, another, nearby library is accessible to at least the main floor.

At the same time, the City recognizes the need to insure access to every neighborhood library, and all local library programs, to all residents. To this end, a substantial commitment of funds has been made in the FY92 and previous capital budgets.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

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***Partially Accessible:** Some barriers exist; usually, this term means that at least the main floor of the building is accessible. It may or may not include access to toilets or to secondary floors.

***Not Accessible:** No access to the building or its functions.

All buildings are owned by the City of Boston and are managed and maintained by the Library Department.

One exception to this is the Upham's Corner Branch Library which is located at the Upham's Corner Municipal Building, managed by the Real Property Department. This library is not included on the attachments to this section because all facilities are listed by owner. The Upham's Corner Library is partially accessible (the lower floor, which is used as a Children's Library, is not currently accessible).

SPECIAL PROBLEMS

Special problems related to access in libraries are all architecture and site related, in some cases coupled with historical significance. The five libraries slated to be studied are all extremely difficult to make accessible due to the age of the architecture and the mode, at the time they were constructed, of building the libraries high off the ground with large stair cases leading to the front door. In some case, especially at the Kirstein Library, extremely restricted sites substantially exacerbate this problem. At those buildings where it was possible — for instance at the Jamaica Plain Library — secondary entrances have been modified to be made accessible.

A second major problem is that many branch libraries are very small which hinders solutions to vertical access within the building, by discouraging additions of elevators and lifts.

PRIORITIES

Priorities for access funds after 1992 are:

- *Unique programs which are inaccessible
- *Inaccessible libraries farthest away from other, accessible facilities.
- *Remaining totally inaccessible libraries to be made accessible to at least the main floor.
- *Provision of accessible toilet facilities at all libraries.
- *Provision of either: interior vertical access at partially accessible libraries or moving programs on inaccessible floors to accessible floors.
- *Provision of access to the Service Building (this building has no public programs) is the lowest priority.

LIBRARIES WHICH WILL HAVE ACCESS PROBLEMS AFTER 1992 FUNDING PROGRAM IS IMPLEMENTED

Using the priorities noted above, these libraries will be slated for capital improvements in future capital plans.

Two program alternatives will be used prior to structural changes being made:

*In the case of inaccessible libraries, accessible libraries are available with similar or identical programs in nearby locations.

*In the case of partially accessible libraries, either nearby accessible libraries may be used for programs on inaccessible floors or programs may be moved to the accessible floor in order to facilitate full participation.

PARKS DEPARTMENT

PARKS DEPARTMENT SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION BUILDINGS AND MAJOR STRUCTURES

This section deals only with the buildings owned by the Parks Department. Some buildings — such as the Duck House on the Boston Public Garden Island — have been ignored as minor structures not for use by people. Parks and other open areas were dealt with in the 1989 Transition Plan prepared by the Parks Department under 504 regulations. This transition plan is attached as an appendix.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

Accessible: No barriers to the entrance of the building, to all floors of the building, and to toilets.

All of these buildings are owned by the City of Boston and operated and maintained by the Parks Department with the exception of the Golf Course Clubhouses which are leased out to private management (???? and the Columbus Park Field House which is leased to the South Boston Neighborhood House for operation as a day care center).

The Parks Department's central offices are located in leased space at 1010 Massachusetts Ave; this space is fully accessible.

Programs

Programs of the Parks Department include providing outdoor recreational programs, the maintenance of parks and other open spaces, the operation of three city owned cemeteries, and other related activities. Their buildings are used to support these outdoor activities.

Current Accessibility Levels

Maintenance Buildings

- *Franklin Park Yard: of these 9 buildings, 5 are accessible, 3 are partially accessible, and one is inaccessible

- *Of the remaining 10 buildings, 3 are accessible, 2 are partially accessible, and five are inaccessible.

Offices

- *The Administration building at Franklin Park is accessible to the first floor only and has no accessible toilets.

Services

- *The Columbus Park Field house was recently upgraded to full access; the Boston Common Ranger station is accessible to the main floor and has no public toilets.

Recreational

- ♦Clubhouses: the George Wright Club House (Hyde Park) is inaccessible; the William Devine Club House (Franklin Park) is accessible.

- *The Jamaica Pond Boathouse was recently upgraded to include access to the first floor and accessible toilets; the second floor has no public programs (storage only).

- *Field Houses: 3 accessible (Columbus Park Stadium, East Boston Stadium, Lee Playground) 2 partially accessible (Ryan Field House, Town field).

- *Parkman Bandstand: the listening/viewing area around the bandstand is accessible, but there is no access to the stage level of the bandstand itself.

Miscellaneous

- *Cemetery Buildings: one is accessible; one is inaccessible; both are used strictly by cemetery personnel.

- *The Jamaica Pond Ranger Station/Bandstand is accessible to the Ranger Station, accessible to the viewing area around the Bandstand, and inaccessible to the stage level of the bandstand. *The Ranger's Unit Trailer is an office for mounted patrol

POLICE DEPARTMENT

POLICE DEPARTMENT SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

After currently scheduled capital improvements are completed, the Police Department will have only one remaining serious access problem, to the District D4 Station on Warren Avenue in the South End. Its other facilities are either accessible or can be programmatically adjusted to not require physical access to all buildings or parts of buildings.

DEFINITIONS

As it is used in this document, access does not necessarily imply full code compliance. Although some buildings may be fully code compliant, the terms as they are used here have the following definitions:

***Accessible:** Access to all floors and accessible toilets.

***Partially accessible:** Accessible to at least one floor; may or may not include accessible toilets.

***Inaccessible:** No access to the building.

All Police Department facilities are owned by the City of Boston and managed and maintained by the Police Department, with the exception of the two dead record storage facilities.

PROGRAMS

The main program of the Police Department is public safety, including police officers on patrol and investigative work. The public has a great deal of interaction with the police, including at police stations and, to a lesser degree, at Headquarters. Interaction at Police Stations includes the reporting of crimes, filing of reports, meeting with car theft detectives, meeting with community services officers, and community meetings. In some

neighborhoods, Community Police Relations meetings are held at locations other than police stations.

Non-public programs include investigative work, training, 911 dispatches, and other programs.

PRIORITIES

Because all other access problems will be solved programmatically, the only priority for access is the District D4 Police station.

PROGRAM ALTERNATIVES PRIOR TO/INSTEAD OF STRUCTURAL CHANGES

At District E18, District A7, District B2 and District C11 all services can be and are provided on the accessible floor. Upper floors are reserved for active duty police officers. At the Central Investigation Division, some public interface is required for witness identification involving police lineups. This service can be moved when needed to the District C6 Station, which is completely accessible and has a line-up space.

Services provided at District D4 can be provided in two ways: at the most convenient other Police Station (i.e. District A1 or District B2) or the rear doors can be opened, with assistance, to provide wheelchair access.

The Police Department will insure that all public meetings — such as monthly Community Police Relations meetings — will be held in accessible locations.

Public Facilities Department

PUBLIC FACILITIES DEPARTMENT

SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

The Public Facilities Department owns three buildings, two of which are leased to private non-profit agencies. The third building -- 15 Beacon Street -- houses about 2/3 of the agency's functions. In addition, PFD has offices located at Real Hancock Street Building and at the School Department's 26 Court Street Building.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

Accessible: No barriers to entrance to the building, to all floors of the building and to toilets.

Partially Accessible: Some barriers exist; usually, this term means that at least the main floor of the building is accessible. It may or may not include access to toilets or to secondary floors.

Not Accessible: No access to the building or its functions

FACILITIES

PFD owns three buildings:

15 Beacon Street -- Offices
Fr. Gilday Center -- non-profit detox center
Strand Theater -- non-profit performing arts center

In addition, PFD operates from two other buildings:

Hancock Street Municipal -- Municipal Police Department
26 Court Street -- School Department Headquarters

PROGRAMS

PFD runs several programs;

- * Construction and repair of municipal facilities
- * Special police operations to protect municipal buildings, schools and parks.
- * Housing and neighborhood development programs.
- * Homeownership and vacant property management services

CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS

The Fr. Gilday Detox Center is partially accessible and the Strand Theater is fully accessible. No city programs are operated from these buildings.

15 Beacon Street is currently inaccessible, but is undergoing minor renovations to make the first floor accessible at this time (there are elevators to other floors; however, bathrooms are not accessible).

Moreover all the 15 Beacon Street offices will move to 26 Court Street, an accessible location, within about a year.

26 Court Street is an accessible building.

Hancock Street has recently undergone renovations which have made the first floor accessible, including toilet facilities. The upper two floors of this building house the operations of the PFD's Municipal Police and are not public spaces.

PRIORITIES

Because 15 Beacon Street is being made partially accessible at this time and because the offices housed at this building are moving to Court Street, at which time all of its programs will be fully accessible, there are no priorities for PFD.

Public Works Department

PUBLIC WORKS SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

This section is divided into two parts. The first deals with buildings owned by the Public Works Department. The second deals with curb cuts and other sidewalk access issues.

BUILDINGS

The Public Works Department does not sponsor any public programs. The function of this department is the maintenance and repair of City bridges, streets and sidewalks.

However, whenever renovations are made, access improvements are included. Therefore, the Hancock Street Garage, Hyde Park Maintenance Yard, Roxbury Maintenance Yard and West Roxbury Yard are now fully accessible through recent capital improvements. In addition, two other buildings are currently in the design process for full accessibility.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

Accessible: No barriers to entrance to the building, to all floors of the building and to toilets.

Partially Accessible: Some barriers exist; usually, this term means that at least the main floor of the building is accessible. It may or may not include access to toilets or to secondary floors.

The American with Disabilities Act (ADA) mandates that all sidewalks be accessible and curb cuts (pedestrian ramps) be installed at each corner of each intersection and whenever a crosswalk or pedestrian path of travel crosses a curb.

CURRENT ACCESIBILITY LEVELS

Reconstruction Programs:

Since 1975, the Boston Public works Department has reconstructed approximately 250 miles of streets and sidewalks resulting in the installation of approximately 8, 00 curb cuts within the City of Boston. These figures represent work done only by the Boston Public Works Department.

Other agencies, such as the Public Facilities Department, With the Neighborhood Business Districts and the Boston Redevelopment Authority, with designated Urban Renewal Project areas, have completed major work. Even though access is substantial, figures not available at this time.

Work completed by the Massachusetts Highway Department (MHD) and the Metropolitan District Commission (MDC) are also not represented.

Estimates of curb cuts installed by agencies other than BPWD, is approximately 7,00 bringing the total curb cuts, within the City of Boston, to approximately 15, 000.

Sidewalk Repair Programs:

Under this program, which consists mainly on repairs to sidewalks, a certain number of ramp installations are set aside to handle individual requests and non compliance. It is estimated that approximately 2,500 ramps have been constructed under this program since 1975.

Note: **All information included in this document is not considered to be complete or accurate. The Department has collected data and information from a variety of sources. Final verification of locations and total curb cuts are subject to the completion of a city-wide access inventory review.**

CURRENT AND FUTURE PROGRAMS:

All of the BWP programs are funded through the Public Facilities Department/Division of Capital Planning.

At present the FY92-95 programs are funded for twelve (12) miles of Highway Reconstruction and one (1) mile of Sidewalk Reconstruction per year. The Sidewalk Repair Program varies depending upon utility impact (approx. 250 ramps/year).

The projected number of curb cuts to be installed between FY92-95 are as follows:

<u>Highway Reconstruction:</u>	=	1536 ramps

(Estimated 8 intersections/mile and 4 corners/intersections for 32 ramps/mile)

PRIORITIES:

Locations of heavy pedestrian concentration and where the installation (new or repair) of curb cuts will have the most impact and the highest priority are as follows:

- Downtown Business District
- Hospital/Clinics
- Schools/Public Buildings
- Neighborhood Business Districts

Transportation Routes
Individual Requests

SHORT TERM OBJECTIVES

In addition to current and future programs and to meet the objectives in the priority areas, BPWD will be requesting funding from PFD/Division of Capital Planning to advertise contracts in the FY93-95 programs for the construction/reconstruction of curb cuts at pre-determined locations.

Also, BPWD will request funding for a city-wide access inventory review process.

LONG TERM OBJECTIVES

As funding allows to:

- 1) During construction, reconstruction or repairing of sidewalks to install curb cuts at each corner of each intersection.
 - 2) Remove other barriers along the public way
 - 3) To establish an inventory system, identifying curb cut locations in the following categories:
 - a) Not existing
 - b) Existing in compliance
 - c) Existing, not in compliance
 - *d) compliance non achievable
- * Variance granted Architectural Access Board
- 4) To evaluate individual requests on a case by case basis

IN CONCLUSION

The BPWD is committed to achieving overall accessibility within the public way. All contracts and programs include the installation of curb cuts at each corner of each intersection as well as the removal of all barriers within infrastructure systems.

Also, BPWD is in the process of compiling information to complete an access inventory review of the 796 miles streets (1592 miles of sidewalks) compromising nearly 7000 intersections.

Undue Administrative Burden

As indicated above the Public Works Department has been able to obtain a broad view of physical obstacles that have been removed and that need to be removed in the area of access to sidewalks via curb cuts. These estimates, however, can not provide a detailed plan of all control. Given obstacles like mild-block depressed driveways, street lights, news boxes and some historically narrow sidewalks the mere installation of curb cuts at corners would not meet the ADA requirements.

In order to obtain the information needed to meet the ADA requirements, the city must complete an in depth on-site study of all of its sidewalks. This will most likely require an outside consultant to walk and document the conditions of each sidewalk.

This study will have no adverse effect in the above priorities, short and long term goals or the individual curb cut request program. It will provide needed information, which may or may not result in undue financial burdens.

Real Property Department

REAL PROPERTY DEPARTMENT

SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

The Real Property Department is responsible for the management and maintenance of those City owned buildings which are occupied by more than one Department, including City Hall. It does not run its own programs from these buildings. Programs run from the buildings are operated by other City Departments, and in some cases, non city agencies.

Some of the information contained in this section is reviewed in more detail in other sections; this is particularly true of Community Schools which operates many programs from Real Property owned buildings.

DEFINITIONS

As used in this document, access does not necessarily mean code compliance. Although in some cases, buildings are completely code compliant, accessibility terms are used as follows:

Accessible: No barriers to entrance to the building, to all floors of the building and to toilets.

Partially Accessible: Some barriers exist; usually, this term means that at least the main floor of the building is accessible. It may or may not include access to toilets or to secondary floors.

Not Accessible: No access to the building or its functions

FACILITIES

The following facilities have no city-sponsored programs and will not be considered for participation in this Transition Plan:

Allston-Brighton Municipal Building: Veronica Smith Senior Center (private, non-profit)

Codman Sq. Municipal Building: Codman Square Health Center (private, non-profit)

East Boston Welfare Building: Leased to the Massachusetts Department of Public Welfare

Roxbury Crossing Welfare Building: Leased to the Massachusetts Department of Public Welfare

Women's Temporary Home: Leased to the Massachusetts Department of Social Services

The remaining facilities can be categorized as follows:

Office building (6)

Recreational/human services (5)

Miscellaneous (Parkman House) (1)

Maintenance (Printing Plant) (1)

All of these buildings are owned by the City of Boston and with the exception of the printing plant, are managed and maintained by the Real Property Department.

PROGRAMS

As noted, the Real Property Department does not run its own programs in these buildings. Information on programs in these buildings can be found:

- (1) Under Community Centers for the Robin, Uphams' Corner, Curtis Hall, Hyde Park, and Roslindale municipal buildings
- (2) In the section on "Other Municipal Programs"

The Hancock Street Municipal Building houses programs run by the Public Facilities Department, including Municipal Police Operations on the second and third floors, and housing construction specialist on the first floor. This building was recently made accessible to the first floor, including bathrooms.

SPECIAL PROBLEMS

City Hall, the City's main office building, was constructed as an accessible building in the late 1960's. However, access standards have since been upgraded and City Hall, while essentially accessible, have some access barriers. Most significantly, the only accessible toilets are on the first floor, the least public floor of the building. The public toilets on the other floors of the building are particularly difficult to restructure to be made accessible. However, funding has been allocated for access improvements to these toilets, a project which is scheduled to begin in the late summer of 1992, and once this capital project is completed, the most significant access barrier at City Hall will be solved.

A list of offices and programs which operate from City Hall is attached.

CURRENTLY FUNDED ACCESS IMPROVEMENTS

Roxbury Crossing Welfare Office – to achieve full access

Roslindale Municipal – (noted as accessible above) – under construction to achieve full access

Hancock St. Municipal – to achieve first floor access and accessible toilets

BUILDING WHICH WILL AHEV ACCESS PROGRAMS AFTER 1992 FUNDING PROGRAM IS IMPLEMENTED

One the currently budgeted improvements are completed, the only remaining access problems will be vertical access in come buildings, and access to on maintenance building (Printing Plant) (not including buildings in which there are no city programs). In most buildings where there is no vertical access, the programs on the upper floors can be accommodated on the first floor whenever necessary to achieve programmatic access.

PRIORITIES

The priority for access is the Upham's Corner Municipal, where lack of vertical access impedes access to programs.

BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

The School Department is responsible for the single largest group of buildings of any one department. There are 77 elementary schools (including Early Learning Centers), 20 middle schools, 15 high schools, 4 specialized schools and 4 other buildings in the school system.

Well over half – 66% -- of all schools still in operation were constructed before World War II. Another 12% were built in the 50's and 60's, and only 26 schools, or 22%, were built since 1970, around the time that accessibility became a regular consideration in designing new public building.

As a group, schools represent the most difficult buildings for barrier removal. A large number of schools have exterior or interior stairs (or both) at every entrance. Very few schools have internal ramp systems or elevators to provide wheel chair access to other floors, and almost all of the schools built through the fifties are three or four levels.

On the other hand because there are a large number of buildings, there are an adequate number of accessible schools which programs can be moved if needed.

PROGRAMS

School Department programs are officially defined as regular, bilingual, vocational, and special education. These are the programs to which students are assigned on an annual basis. Other considerations for student assignment are related to desegregation orders, currently based in a controlled choice system within three geographical zones for elementary and middle schools, and one citywide zone for high schools. Regular education programs include advance work classes for children in grades 4, 5 and 6, and extended day kindergarten programs. Bilingual programs are offered at all levels, in 10 different languages.

In bilingual classes, children are taught both in their native language and in English. One or two schools also offer what is called two-way bilingual education: two classes participate in this program – one a native speaking class and the other a native Spanish speaking class. In a few schools, bilingual extended day kindergarten is offered. Finally, some schools offer vocational education as apart of the regular curriculum.

Special education programs are offered to all children who have special learning needs based on physical, visual, hearing or mental disabilities. Not all special education programs are offered from Boston Public School buildings (some children attend schools in other cities and towns or at private schools). Special education programs range from programs for deaf and blind children, to mentally retarded children, emotionally disturbed children, children with mobility impairments and children with a combination of physical and mental disabilities.

Programs for children who have special learning needs coupled with physical disabilities are placed in accessible locations in schools. Thus, we have not listed special needs programs in the attached list programs dealing with children with multiple disabilities, which include mobility problems, are already accessible.

The attached pages list all regular and bilingual programs, which schools they are in and the accessibility status of each building. In most cases, although not all, duplicate programs are available in accessible locations.

CURRENT ACCESSIBILITY LEVELS

Currently, 35 are defined as accessible. Accessible for this purpose means that a person using a wheelchair can get into the building, to very level of the building and to an accessible bathroom. Accessible does not imply cod compliance, as many of these schools were constructed under handicapped access of a lower standard than those of 1992.

Accessibility breaks out as follows by type of school:

The Capital Plan through 1992 includes funding to remove barriers at the following schools. All of these projects have either gone to bid or will go out to bid very soon:

In addition, the 1922 capital plan includes funding for a major school survey, discussed below.

CURRENT MASTER PLANNING EFFORT FOR THE SCHOOLS

Currently is a major master planning effort for the Boston Public Schools. Included in this section is a description of the master planning effort.

The first step of the Master Planning effort will be a physical conditions survey of all schools. This survey will include a report on current barriers, and cost estimates for barrier removal. The Master Planning effort is extremely comprehensive and may include, in its findings, recommendations for school additions, consolidations, new construction and closings. These recommendations will be based on a wide range of factors including demographic information and educational policy.

Because of all-encompassing nature of the school master planning effort, information compiled for this transition plan was based only on the three major criteria for accessibility – is the building accessible, is every level of the building accessible, and are there accessible toilet facilities. The master planning effort

will be far more detailed, including such issues as level changes in floors or in classrooms, access to auditoriums and other general use facilities and other information.

Because of the nature, scope and timing of the master planning work, it is not credible to make major policy and funding decisions about handicapped access prior to obtaining the results of this study. Continuing to ensure that all school programs are accessible to all be done within the broader context of priorities set to insure that these same schools meet all of the other needs of students in the system, both disabled and non-disabled students.

At the same time, schools currently undergoing renovations, or in design for renovations under the current capital plan, will all receive access improvements.

PROGRAMMATIC ALTERNATIVES PRIOR TO STUCTURAL CHANGES

As noted above, all special needs programs for children who have physical disabilities are currently located in accessible schools. In some other programs, such as certain bilingual programs, there currently is no program in an accessible location. The master plan will provide more information on how to best locate these programs.

In the event that an otherwise qualified student with a disability is unable to participate in any regular, bilingual or special education program due to structural barriers that program will be moved to accommodate the student or necessary structural changes will be made.

PRIORITIES

Priorities will be developed based on the mater plan. The following are general priority guidelines until such as the specific master plan is developed:

- 1) All students shall have equal access to programs; structural barriers will be removed if this is the only way to allow a student to participate
- 2) Each zone should have roughly the same number of accessible schools at each level.
- 3) Middle schools will continue to be a priority until the percentage of middle school which are accessible roughly equates the percentage of elementary and high schools which are accessible.

MASTER PLAN FOR BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS FACILITIES PROPOSAL

INTRODUCTION

The City of Boston is about to embark upon a detailed and comprehensive needs assessment to produce a master plan for Boston's school facilities. The plan will guide school facilities decisions for a period of at least 10 years.

The master planning process is proposed as a partnership between the City's construction agencies and the School Department and School Board, parents, teachers and others. It will be built upon an assessment of current conditions and school space inventory, demographic trends and the school department's vision for educational policy and programs.

A number of surveys and capital plans have been prepared over the last three decades; however, an in-depth and comprehensive survey comparing existing facilities to current educational needs has not been completed since the sergeant report, issued in 1962. The sergeant report laid the groundwork for decisions on school closings and new construction in the 60's and 70's. The study City is about to undertake will match or exceed the breadth of the sergeant report.

The current capital plan for Boston's public schools originates from the United Facilities plan (UFP), a 1985 court-ordered schedule of school renovation and construction mandating \$69 million in school improvements. Over the last 7 years, the City has far exceeded the court ordered plan. Since 1985, the City has made significant improvements to almost half of the City's schools and has more than doubled the \$69 million investment originally mandated in 1985. This year's Capital Plan outlines \$187 million in school investment, a \$22 million increase over last year's plan and will result in the renovation of 89 of the City's 115 school facilities.

Between 1985-1988 the backlog of basic physical needs of many school buildings required the City to focus solely on a case by case basis such as repairing roofs, heating systems and basic building infrastructure. By 1989, with the majority of these conditions resolved, the capital plan turned to modernizing classrooms, libraries, gymnasiums, laboratories and cafeterias to produce more extensive and visible school improvements.

Today, with seven years of comprehensive renovations behind us and a three year schedule of improvements ahead of us, the City is facing new challenges.

In the past year, the City has witnessed a major reform in school governance. The newly appointed school board and school superintendent mark a new era in school administration. Additionally, future reforms of school programs will need to be closely integrated with the planning of future capital investment.

At the same time, Boston continues to be faced with a stock of very old buildings. Well over half (66%) of Boston's schools currently in use were built before World War II, about half of those before 1920. They are solid and architecturally pleasing buildings and the influx of capital dollars has made them clean and well lit environments for learning. These buildings, however, often fall short of modern educational needs. Many schools lack cafeterias, libraries, gymnasiums, adequate outdoor athletic and recreational spaces, computer learning spaces, science laboratories, provisions for group guidance, health centers,

provisions for chapter 1 and other special educational spaces, music rooms, art rooms and other features which make up a modern educational environment.

The master plan will lay the ground work for planning new buildings and continuing the rehabilitation program begun seven years ago. It will be a plan informed not only by what we have – our current building stock – but what we want. It will be a building renovation plan based on educational vision.

MASTER PLAN FOR BOSTON SCHOOL FACILITIES WORKPLAN

OVERVIEW

The master plan is proposed to be done in three phases:

| Phase I | (in the process) This phase will present a history of facilities decisions for the last three decades, starting with the sergeant report of 1962. it will include closings, new construction, impact of court decisions, and other factors. The report will provide an historical context and an understanding of why the system is as it is today. A review of the factors leading up to decisions regarding facilities closings and new construction in the last 30 years will provide us with a better understanding and give us an opportunity to learn from the past. A draft of this report should be ready for review in June, 1992. |
| Phase II | A physical needs assessment will be conducted of all schools. This phase of the study will examine and quantify all building and outdoor spaces, including current conditions, gather information on all current programs and enrollments, and inventory of all special school spaces (gyms, libraries, laboratories, etc) to all determine the capacity of each school to house various programs. This assessment will be completed by a consulting firm with architectural, engineering and planning experience and should be completed by January 1993. |
| Phase III | The final and most important phase will be the actual development of the master plan – the integration of information on facilities conditions and inventory with demographic trends and educational policy. Demographic information, which will have been collected at this time, will be analyzed along side educational programs, policies and priorities as presented by the Superintendent and school board. The analysis required to integrate this with the facilities condition information can begin early in 1993 and be completed by the late spring of 1993. |

PAHSE I: RECENT SCHOOL FACILITIES HISTORY

Phase I of the comprehensive needs assessment is the preparation of a report on the recent history of school facilities decision making. This phase is in process and a draft report will be ready for review in June, 1992.

This report covers the period starting in the early sixties with the sergeant report and ending with today's capital plan. Included in the report is a history of school closings and new construction as well as background information on court-ordered desegregation and other influences on facility decision making.

PHASE II: ASSESSMENT OF CURRENT INVENTORY AND CONDITIONS

The public facilities department will contact with a consulting firm to conduct a survey to quantify and assess the current inventory and condition of all schools. This study will include:

- 1) Information on the current condition of all buildings, sites athletic spaces ad mechanical systems, including a code analysis (including handicapped access) and cost estimates for al needed upgrades.
- 2) Information on capital improvements completed or in the process through the duration of the current capital plan
- 3) Information obtained through other recent studies, including the AHERA asbestos study
- 4) Inventory of all educational spaces and their uses, including indoor and outdoor recreational and athletic spaces.
- 5) Inventory of all programs currently located in each school including regular education, bilingual education, special education, afterschool programs, athletic programs, and evening programs.
- 6) Current enrollment, building capacity and enrollment capacity

The major source of information for the survey will be on-site inspections of every building. Other sources will include school department and public facilities department central files and interviews with principals/headmasters, zone staff, central school department staff, custodians and others. The result will be a current conditions report, including facility physical condition and current programmatic use of facilities. All of this information will be entered into a computerized data base for analysis purposes.

Designer selection for a firm to conduct this survey is on-going now. Contract negotiations and processing should be complete by July, at which point a period of approximately 2 months will be spent designing the data collection format and methodology. Building surveys should be complete, with all data collected, by January 1993.

PHASE III: MASTER PLANNING

The master planning phase is the most important phase of the project – the integration of facilities information with demographic information and education policy, programs, and priorities. Policy decisions by the school department and school board will have to precede the start-up of this phase and it will be necessary for the school board, school department staff, parents and teachers to play an active role during this period. The City will be looking to the school department and school board to identify and articulate its vision for the education of the students of Boston.

Information on current demographics and demographics trends will be analyzed to determine school age trends, trends by neighborhoods, land use patterns and other information.

It is proposed that the School Board and school Superintendent be responsible for providing information regarding educational programs and policies to the program director. Information concerning anticipated and desired programmatic changes will be necessary to analyze the impact of new programs on facilities use and to prepare a model facilities plan to meet the changing educational needs of Boston.

A list of programmatic and policy needs will have to be developed for this phase of the study. The following is a preliminary list of the kind of pragmatic factors which may need to be considered. This list is not exclusive, and in fact, the final list of considerations must be determined by the School department and the school Board.

- 1) Impact of laws and court orders on program sitting and availability, including desegregation, special education, bilingual education, and handicapped access.
- 2) Anticipated changing needs for bilingual education.
- 3) Curriculum changes which need unique facility features.
- 4) Definition of goals and structures for special needs programs.
- 5) Grade structure of early childhood education, kindergarten, elementary, middle and secondary programs
- 6) Special programs/citywide schools and their locations.
- 7) Projected class sizes
- 8) Student assignment practices.
- 9) Future goals for music, the arts, technical education.
- 10) Community/parental use of school facilities

The collection of information on demographics and educational policy will be concurrent with the physical survey of schools. Final analysis, drafting and reviews will begin when all information is collected and the master plan report should be complete by the start of the 1993 school year.

STAFFING AND STRUCTURE

On the City's part, the study will be staffed by a Public Facilities department (PFD) project director and project manager. The project director will require the active participation of the superintendent, senior policy planners, and possibly educational consultants, who will interact with PFD's staff throughout the process. An advisory committee is proposed including parents, teachers, principals/headmasters, other school department staff and others. A description of the major project roles follows:

STAFFING

The Project Director will be responsible for:

- 1) General project oversight
- 2) Coordinating with staff assigned by the superintendent for purposes of collection information
- 3) Managing the work of any external consultants hired by the City which may be used to advise on data collection, demographics, analysis, modeling, etc.
- 4) Keeping all parties informed
- 5) Keeping master files
- 6) Coordination the analysis of information and producing drafts and a final version of a master plan that meets the goals of the study
- 7) Organizing an advisory committee to be established

The Project Manager will be responsible for:

- 1) Managing the consultant survey that will collect all the current conditions and inventory information and assembling the data into a computer data base
- 2) Organizing the technical resources of the Public Facilities Department into a technical advisory team for the architectural and engineering study to insure quality results
- 3) Coordinating the work of other city agency involvement (i.e. Public Works, Parks, etc.)
- 4) Assisting in final production of the master plan

The staff working group will be made up of the Public Facilities Project manager, capital budget planner, PFD design reviewer, school department facilities staff and staff from other City departments as may be needed from time to time to coordinate the work related to the current conditions assessment.

OVERSIGHT

The steering committee will be made up of the senior level City Department staff who will set policy for the direction of the study. Critical members of this committee will include the director of the public facilities department (responsible for planning capital budgets and carrying out all new construction and capital improvements work) and the school superintendent, responsible for developing and carrying out educational policy.

The advisory committee will be made up of interested parties. The make up of the committee is not yet established but should include representatives from the City and school department, educational experts from nearby universities, representatives of parent organizations, members of the business community and others.

The Boston school board has ultimate responsibility for setting educational policy. Staff will look to the school board for educational guidance.

The Mayor's office has responsibility for setting capital budgets for approval by the City council. Mayoral policy staff will be consulted throughout the process for information on City finances and neighborhood impacts of school facilities planning.

Transportation Department

TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The Transportation department has only two buildings, both with limited access public access.

DEFINITIONS

As it is used in this document, access does not imply full code compliance. Although some buildings are fully compliant, the terms as they are used in here have the following definitions:

- ***Accessible:** Access to all floors and accessible toilets.
 ***Partially accessible:** Accessible to at least one floor, may or may not include access to toilets.
 ***Inaccessible:** No access to the building

FACILITIES

Maintenance Building – shops, etc. for maintenance of traffic signals, signage, etc.; includes some office space

Tow and Hold Lot – offices to process citizens, retrieval of towed cars, stored stolen vehicles, etc. and adjacent towed vehicles storage area.

(Main offices are located in City Hall, covered under the Real Property Department section of this Transitions Plan)

PROGRAMS

The Transportation department is responsible for:

- * Street Signage
- * Setting and enforcing parking rules (ticketing, towing and booting)
- * Traffic light maintenance
- * Planning and implementing traffic and transportation policy
- * Educational programs on pedestrian and other safety issues

Other City Departments

OTHER CITY DEPARTMENTS

SUMMARY OF ACCESS INFORMATION

Some City agencies operate their programs from buildings which are not under their jurisdiction. Most of these departments are noted under Real Property (with the exception of Inspectional Services) or another section. This section deals with those programs which deserve more attention than they have received in another section, or like ISD, have not been mentioned at all.

INSPECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT

The Inspectional Services Department (ISD) issues building permits, inspects buildings under construction, sets policy for building construction standards, responds to housing complaints by inspecting rental units and issuing corrective orders, operates an animal control unit and performs other related work. Much of the work of this department is done in the field, although the public has a variety of reasons to go to their offices, such as filing permit applications.

This department operates from a rental space at 1010 Massachusetts Avenue in Roxbury. This building has been completely renovated and is accessible.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT INDUSTRIAL CORPORATION/JOBS AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

This agency is responsible for economic development in the City of Boston. In addition, the Office of Jobs and Community Services is responsible for overseeing compliance with resident jobs policies and the use of disadvantaged businesses in City contracting. Both agencies run a number of jobs and economic development related programs. The offices of this agency are at 35/43 Hawkins Street, a Real Property building which has recently undergone extensive renovations and is accessible.

ELECTION DEPARTMENT

The Election Department's Offices are on the second floor of the City Hall (see description of City Hall Accessibility issues under Real Property). Its responsibilities include registering voters, maintaining voting lists, and running local, state and federal elections at about 200 neighborhood locations.

The election department's policy is to always site polling places in accessible locations. This policy has led to the placement of polling places in the MBTA stations, fire houses, and other less than perfect sites.

VETERAN'S SERVICES

The Veteran's Services office assists armed services veterans with a variety of problems. They operate from Real Property Church Street building in the South End. This building is accessible by ramp to the first floor, where most of the offices are, there is one on accessible bathroom on that floor now and more are being constructed in the upcoming projects. There is an elevator but it is extremely small and can not be considered compliant. However, all programs of the Veterans Services can be moved to the first floor as required to accommodate disabled visitors or employees.

PRINTING DIVISION

The printing division of the City of Boston performs in-house printing of all kinds for city use, including letterhead, envelopes, brochures, invitations, etc. It operates from a plant on North Street in the North End. It is an inaccessible building.

The public does not visit this building at any time. In the event that an otherwise qualified individual with a disability were unable to work in this building due to structural barriers, the City would make a reasonable accommodation to allow such an individual to work there, either by making structural changes or by moving the work location if practical.
