THE CITIES HAVE BEEN WORKING TOGETHER THE LAST FEW YEARS WITHOUT ANY FORMAL FUNDING. JUST EACH WORKING INTERNALLY ON IDENTIFYING PROJECTS FOR COLLABORATION. THIS WILL BE THE FIRST YEAR WHERE THERE WILL BE FUNDING FOR A CONSULTANT TO GREAT A TO-DO LIST ESSENTIALLY OF PROJECTS THAT COULD EXPAND EACH OF THE CITIES. I WANT TO THANK THE CHIEF OF STAFF FROM THE OFFICE OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FOR PRESENTING ON THAT ONE. SPECTER CAME AND PRESENTED --THIS IS A TWO-PART GRANT. MOST OF US WILL GO THROUGH THE NEXT PHASE OF SURVEY ROXBURY AND UNDERSTAND THE HISTORICAL PARCELS AND WHO LIVES THERE. THERE MAY BE ANOTHER PHASE IN ROXBURY OR THEY MAY WRAP UP AND MOVE ON TO A NEW NEIGHBORHOOD IN YEARS TO COME. HEARING YESTERDAY. IT WAS ABOUT FOUR AND A HALF HOURS LONG. WANTED TO BEGIN BY THANKING MY COSPONSORS ON THIS VERY TIMELY AND IMPORTANT TOPIC. THE DISTRICT COUNCILOR FROM SOUTH BOSTON AND PARTICIPATION FROM COUNCILOR FROM EAST BOSTON AND THE COUNCILOR AT-LARGE FROM SOUTH BOSTON, THE COUNCILOR FROM ROXBURY, THE COUNCILORS FROM REEDVILLE, AND THE COUNCILOR FROM BACK BAY. YOU CAN SEE I'M FULLY EMBRACING OUR COUNCIL RULE THAT WE MUSTN'T NAME EACH OTHER, ONLY OUR DISTRICT. WE HAD THREE PANELS. WE BEGAN WITH FOLKS FROM THE ADMINISTRATION WHO SORT OF GAVE SOME OVERSIGHT IN TERMS OF WHAT THEY HAVE TO DO AND WHAT THEY OUGHT TO DO IN THE UNLIKELY BUT EVENT OF A REAL EMERGENCY. NATIONAL GRID WORKERS AND JOE AND JOHN AS WELL AS RICH ROGERS AND DARLENE FROM THE GREATER BOSTON LABOR COUNCIL WERE THERE. THEN WE HAD OUR THIRD PANEL, NATHAN PHILLIPS, AUDREY SHULMAN, AND OTHERS. TELLINGLY, UNSURPRISINGLY, IT WAS IMPORTANT TO KNOW WHO WAS NOT THERE. THAT WAS NATIONAL GRID, WHO HAD BEEN INVITED. WE WANTED TO HAVE A CONSTRUCTIVE CONVERSATION BUT A FRANK AND HONEST AND PERHAPS A DIFFICULT CONVERSATION. THEY SENT WORD TO MY OFFICE LATE ON FRIDAY OF LAST WEEK THAT THEY WOULD NOT BE ATTENDING. SIMILARLY, WE INVITED FOLKS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES, WHICH IS A STATE AGENCY THAT PLAYS A SIGNIFICANT ROLE, AND GAS PIPELINE SAFETY, AND THEY, TOO, DECLINED. IT WAS VERY DISAPPOINTING, BUT NEVERTHELESS, WE HAD A VERY INFORMATIVE HEARING. I ASK RESPECTFULLY THAT THIS

MATTER REMAIN IN COMMITTEE BECAUSE THERE'S STILL WORK THAT WE NEED TO DO AND THE COSPONSORS AND I WORKING IN CONCERT WITH ALL OF YOU NEED TO FIGURE OUT WHAT OUR NEXT STEPS ARE BECAUSE WE RECOGNIZE THE FACT THAT WE HAVE AN ISSUE HERE. WHAT HAPPENED IN THE MERRIMACK VALLEY COULD HAPPEN IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. WE HAVE SIMILARLY OLD AND IN DISREPAIR INFRASTRUCTURE. WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY AND OBLIGATION TO DO EVERYTHING WE POSSIBLY CAN TO MAKE SURE WE HAVE SAFETY CITY FOR RESIDENTS AND VISITORS ALIKE. I ASK THAT THE MATTER REMAIN IN COMMITTEE AND THANK ALL OF YOU FOR YOUR PARTICIPATION AND ENGAGEMENT AT YESTERDAY'S HEARING. >> COUNCILOR FLYNN, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR. >> THANK YOU, MADAME PRESIDENT. A TOPIC THAT IS UNFORTUNATELY STILL WITH US TODAY IN SOCIETY, THE STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS, AND THE CITY, AND THAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT. THIS MONTH, OCTOBER, HAS BEEN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH. AS A FORMER PROBATION OFFICER, I WORK CLOSELY WITH VICTIMS AND THOSE THAT COMMITTED ACTS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AS WELL. I ALSO KNOW THE GREAT WORK THE CITY OF BOSTON IS ALSO DOING ON THIS IMPORTANT ISSUE. I ACKNOWLEDGE AND COMMEND MAYOR WALSH AND HIS ADMINISTRATION AS WELL. WE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON TAKE GREAT PRIDE IN KNOWING THAT THE NATION OFTEN LOOKS TO US FOR GUIDANCE DUE TO OUR PROGRESSIVE POLICIES AND OUTLOOK ON SO MANY DIFFERENT ISSUES. HOWEVER, ACCORDING TO JANE DOE, THE MASSACHUSETTS COALITION ON DOMESTIC ASSAULT AND VIOLENCE, I'M AFRAID OUR COMMUNITY IS NOT IMMUNE TO THIS BEHAVIOR. ACCORDING TO DATA COMPILED BY JANE DOE AND THE MASSACHUSETTS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, STATISTICS INDICATE THAT MASSACHUSETTS WAS ON PAR WITH NATIONAL AVERAGES. NEARLY 1 IN 3 WOMEN AND 1 IN 5 MEN IN MASSACHUSETTS HAVE EXPERIENCED RAPE, PHYSICAL VIOLENCE, AND/OR STALKING BY AN INTIMATE PARTNER IN THEIR LIVES. 11% OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS, 6% OF MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS REPORTED BEING HURT BY A DATE SOMETIME IN THEIR LIFE. BETWEEN 2003 AND 2012, JANE DOE IDENTIFIED 266 VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE-RELATED HOMICIDES AND ADDITIONAL 174 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HOMICIDES IN

MASSACHUSETTS. THESE STATISTICS MAY NOT ACCOUNT FOR IMMIGRANTS, MEMBERS OF THE LGBTQ COMMUNITY, AND THOSE WHO ARE HESITANT TO CONTACT LAW ENFORCEMENT. I BELIEVE WE HAVE A RESPONSIBILITY TO SEEK WAYS TO REDUCE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND INCREASE REPORTING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL OUR COMMUNITIES. IT IS IMPERATIVE WE EDUCATE EVERY COMMUNITY IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, PROVIDING A COMFORTING AND SAFE ATMOSPHERE FOR VICTIMS AND OFFER AN OUTLET TO THOSE WHO MAY BE HESITANT TO SPEAK OUT. THIS WORK I WOULD LIKE TO CONTINUE AND LOOK TO BUILD ON FROM BACK WHEN MY MOTHER, KATHY FLYNN, WORKED ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROGRAMS. I'M PROUD OF THE WORK SHE DID, BUT I'M ALSO PROUD OF THE WORK THAT SO MANY OTHER MOTHERS DID THROUGHOUT THE CITY. I WANT TO HAVE THIS CONVERSATION TO MAKE SURE WE ARE DOING ALL WE CAN AS A CITY TO INCREASE AWARENESS ABOUT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT IN OUR CITY, TO MAKE SURE WE'RE DOING ALL WE CAN TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC, THAT WE'RE DOING ALL WE CAN TO SUPPORT VICTIMS AND OFFER OPPORTUNITIES FOR REPORTING FOR ALL COMMUNITIES, AND HOPEFULLY FIND WAYS TO REDUCE AND BRING ABOUT AN END TO THIS CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR. THANK YOU, MADAME PRESIDENT. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR FLYNN. COUNCILOR CAMPBELL. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR CIOMMO. THANK YOU, COUNCILOR FLYNN, FOR YOUR PARTNERSHIP. I THINK THE DATA IS ASTOUNDING AND QUITE SAD. GIVEN THE CONTEXT OF THESE ISSUES THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT, I THINK THIS IS AN OPPORTUNE TIME TO BRING EVERYBODY TOGETHER AT A HEARING AROUND WHAT THE CITY OF BOSTON CAN DO NOT JUST

FOR THOSE WHO ARE OUTSIDE OF OUR CITY BUT EVEN THOSE WHO HAVE CONCERNS [INAUDIBLE]. I WANT TO THANK COUNCILOR PRESSLEY FOR HER WORK ON THIS. THANK YOU, COUNCILOR FLINN, FOR THE PARTNERSHIP. I LOOK FORWARD TO THE FIRST HEARING AND SEVERAL CONVERSATIONS ABOUT WHAT CONCRETE SOLUTIONS, WHETHER IN TERMS OF REPORTING, MAKING IT EASIER FOR FOLKS TO COME FORWARD, HOUSING, CASH ASSISTANCE TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR FOLKS WHO ARE INVOLVED IN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INCIDENTS. LET'S JUST BE CLEAR. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INCIDENTS, THIS HAS A CYCLE. THESE ARE PATTERNS OF BEHAVIOR. THEY'RE NOT ONE-OFFS. THERE'S A CLINIC THAT FOCUSES ON THIS. THERE'S A LOT MORE THAT WE NEED TO DO TO ADDRESS THESE ISSUES AND TO MAKE IT EASIER NOT JUST FOR FOLKS TO BE HEARD BUT TO ALSO REMEDY THEIR CIRCUMSTANCES TO ALLOW THEM TO BE HEALTHY, LOVED, AND TO LIVE IN A SAFE COMMUNITY. THANK YOU, COUNCILOR FLYNN, AGAIN. >> THANK YOU. COUNCILOR FLAHERTY. COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE, COUNCILOR EDWARDS, COUNCILOR JANEY, COUNCILOR PRESSLEY, COUNCILOR WU, AND THE CHAIR. >> CHAIR RECOGNIZES COUNCILOR ZAKIM. >> THAT'S WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU GET AMATEURS UP THERE. THANK YOU, MR. VICE PRESIDENT. I WANT TO RISE TO ASK MY NAME BE ADDED. I WANT TO COMMEND THE MAKERS FOR POINTING OUT THE ISSUES THAT PEOPLE IN OUR IMMIGRANT COMMUNITIES HAVE IN REGARD TO REPORTING VIOLENCE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT.

THAT WAS ONE OF THE CENTRAL REASONS THAT WE THOUGHT IT WAS IMPORTANT THAT PEOPLE REGARDLESS OF THEIR IMMIGRATION STATUS COULD SAFELY CALL THE BOSTON POLICE FOR ASSISTANCE TO WORK THE BOSTON HEALTH COMMISSION AND OTHERS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. ESPECIALLY NOW, YEARS LATER, WHERE EVERY DAY THERE ARE ATTACKS ON IMMIGRANTS WHERE PEOPLE ARE LIVING IN FEAR -- IN MANY CASES RIGHTFULLY SO -- WE NEED TO REMIND FOLKS, AT LEAST IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, THAT INTERACTING WITH OUR CITY AGENCIES, WITH THE BOSTON PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION AND THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT, THAT INFORMATION IS NOT GOING TO BE SHARED. THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT DOES NOT DETAIN PEOPLE BASED ON THEIR IMMIGRATION STATUS. THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DISCUSSION TO HAVE. >> THANK YOU. COUNCILOR ZAKIM IS ASSIGNED TO THE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SAFETY. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR CIOMMO. MOVING ON TO PERSONNEL ORDERS. >> DOCKET 1590, COUNCILOR CAMPBELL FOR COUNCILOR ZAKIM. >> COUNCILOR ZAKIM SEEKS SUSPENSION OF THE RULES AND PASSAGE OF 1590. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR SAY AYE. [CHORUS OF AYES] >> THE AYES HAVE IT. THERE IS ONE LATE FILE WHICH IN THE ABSENCE OF AN OBJECTION WILL BE ADDED. SEEING AND HEARING NO OBJECTION, THE MATTER IS ADDED TO THE AGENDA. MADAME CLERK? >> THANK YOU, MADAME PRESIDENT. OCTOBER 30th, 2018, COUNCILOR CAMPBELL FOR COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE. >> COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE SEEKS SUSPENSION OF THE RULES AND PASSAGE.

ALL THOSE IN FAVOR SAY AYE. [CHORUS OF AYES] >> THE AYES HAVE IT. THE LATE FILE MATTER HAS BEEN PASSED. ANYONE WISHING TO REMOVE A MATTER FROM THE GREEN SHEETS? NO. MOVING RIGHT ALONG. I'M INFORMED BY THE CLERK THERE ARE ZERO LATE FILE MATTERS FOR THE CONSENT AGENDA. SEEING AND HEARING -- ACTUALLY, LET ME CORRECT THAT. ZERO LATE FILES FOR THE CONSENT AGENDA, RIGHT, MADAME CLERK? THANK YOU, MADAME CLERK. AT THIS TIME, THE CHAIR MOVES FOR ADOPTION OF THE CONSENT AGENDA. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR SAY AYE. [CHORUS OF AYES] >> THE AYES HAVE IT. THE CONSENT AGENDA HAS BEEN PASSED. BEFORE I MOVE ON TO ANY ANNOUNCEMENTS, IF ANYONE WANTS TO SAY ANYTHING BEFORE THE MEETING ENDS, OBVIOUSLYCONGRAJ CONGRADUAL LATION --CONGRATULATIONS TO THE RED SOX. JUST A POINT OF CLARIFICATION ON THE RULES. WE HAD SOME BACK AND FORTH RELATED TO SIGNS, SO I HAD TO CHECK IN WITH EVERY OFFICE ON WHETHER OR NOT THEY WANTED TO ALLOW SIGNS IN THE CHAMBER. CURRENTLY THE RULES SAY NO SIGNS. THE MAJORITY WON. I REMOVE MYSELF FROM THAT. BUT THE MAJORITY -- I REMOVED MYSELF UNTIL THE VERY END. THERE WAS A LARGER MAJORITY TO KEEP THE RULES AS-IS, WHICH IS TO HAVE NO SIGNS IN THE CHAMBER. CENTRAL STAFF WILL GO OUT AND TALK TO EVERY OFFICE, PARTICULARLY THOSE WHO WANTED IT AND TELL YOU WHY AND WHAT THEIR CONVERSATION WAS. JUST WANTED TO SAY THAT BEFORE

ALL OF YOU. I DON'T WANT TO MAKE THESE DECISIONS WHEN IT COMES TO THE RULES UNILATERALLY. JUST PUTTING THAT OUT THERE. COUNCILOR WU? >> REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO MAKE A STATEMENT? YOU CAN SEE THE SORT OF REMNANTS OF IT, BUT I WANT TO GIVE A BIG, BIG THANK YOU TO MADAME PRESIDENT AND HER TEAM, CENTRAL STAFF, AND ALL THE OFFICES FOR MAKING SURE THAT THE DAY CARE KIDS HAD FUN TRICK-OR-TREATING AROUND THE CHAMBER EARLIER. THEY'RE NAPPING NOW. WE HAD A TUNNEL OVER HERE THAT COUNCILOR ZAKIM'S OFFICE BUILT. THEY DIDN'T GET TO GO ALL AROUND THE BUILDING THIS YEAR, SO THIS IS REALLY SPECIAL FOR THEM. SO MANY OFFICES CAME AND HELPED SET UP, HELPED TAKE DOWN, AND GOT TO SPEND TIME WITH THEM. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILOR WU. THANK YOU TO EVERY COUNCILOR AND THEIR TEAM FOR MAKING THIS A SPECIAL OCCASION. WE HEARD REALLY GOOD THINGS, SO THANK YOU, COUNCILOR WU, FOR TAKING THE LEAD. >> I ASK UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO MAKE AN INVITATION REGARDING A NARCAN TRAINING TOMORROW AT 11:00. >> THANK YOU. >> PART OF OUR DISCUSSIONS AROUND THE OPIOID CRISIS AND THE WORK WE COULD BE DOING, ONE OF THE REQUESTS WAS TO DO SOME OF THESE TRAININGS. WE DID IT A LITTLE OVER A YEAR AGO, SO WE HAVE THE BOSTON PUBLIC HEALTH COMMISSION TEAM HERE TOMORROW TO DO A NARCAN TRAINING. ANYONE HERE IN CITY HALL IS WELCOME TO JOIN US FROM 11:00 --WE'LL BE DONE BY NOON. >> THANK YOU. COUNCILOR FLAHERTY, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR.

>> I WANT TO UPDATE SOMETHING THAT HAPPENED IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD THISDISCOVERED IN A SCHOOL THIS MORNING, IT WAS DISGUSTING HATE SPEECH. WE'RE SADDENED AND OUTRAGED AT WHAT APPEARED ON THE DOORS OF THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND THE DAMAGE THAT WAS DONE TO THAT SCHOOL AS WELL AS TO OUR COMMUNITY. THAT'S NOT WHO WE ARE AS A COMMUNITY. IT'S NOT WHO WE ARE AS A CITY. THERE'S NO SPACE FOR THAT TYPE OF DIVISIVE BEHAVIOR. OUR SCHOOLS SHOULD BE SAFE HAVENS FOR OUR CHILDREN TO LEARN AND TO GROW REGARDLESS OF THEIR RACE, THEIR RELIGION, ETHNICITY. THIS MORNING, WE SPOKE TO BPS OFFICIALS AS WELL AS SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS AT THE TIME ALONG WITH THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT. WE'VE BEEN IN TOUCH WITH THE MAYOR AND SUPERINTENDENT TO ADDRESS THIS MATTER. WE'RE COMMITTED TO FINDING THE PERSON OR PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS. WE'LL CONTINUE TO BE A RESOURCE FOR THE SCHOOL AND THE GREATER COMMUNITY AT LARGE, WHICH IS OUR WHOLE CITY. COUNCILOR FLYNN AND I, WORKING WITH THE LOCAL OFFICIALS, WE'LL DO SOMETHING LIKE COFFEE AND CONVERSATION OR COMMUNITY BREAKFAST TOMORROW MORNING OR FRIDAY MORNING AT THE SCHOOL. WE OBVIOUSLY INVITE OUR COLLEAGUES TO ATTEND. JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE I DIDN'T LET THE DAY GO BY WITHOUT DISCUSSING HOW DISGUSTED WE WERE AT WHAT OCCURRED. WE MET IMMEDIATELY WITH THE PRINCIPAL AND THE SUPERINTENDENT AS WELL AS THE POLICE CAPTAIN. WE'RE GOING TO GET SOME ADDITIONAL LIGHTING DOWN THERE AND SOME CAMERAS DOWN THERE AS WELL.

WE'RE GOING TO CONTINUE TO WORK TOGETHER TO DO OUR PART, BUT JUST WANT TO PUT IT ON THE RECORD THAT THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE IS ABSOLUTELY DISGUSTED AND OUTRAGED AT WHAT OCCURRED ON WHAT SHOULD HAVE BEEN A GREAT CELEBRATORY DAY TODAY WITH OUR BOSTON RED SOX. >> THANK YOU. ANYONE ELSE LOOKING TO MAKE AN ANNOUNCEMENT?
