>> COUNCILLOR WU, YOU HAVE THE FLOOR.

>> THANK YOU, MADAM PRESIDENT. I'M EXCITED TO CONTINUE PARTNER COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY.

WE HAVE A FEW TWEAKS TO MAKE SOME CLARIFICATIONS BASED ON THE HEARING THAT WE HAD SEVERAL

MONTHS AGO AT THIS POINT.

I'D LIKE TO TALK ABOUT THIS

ORDINANCE AS ONE OF THOSE THAT IS TANGIBLE TO THE CITY. WHEN YOU SAY WETLANDS, YOU ENVISION A CLIMATE THAT YOU MIGHT NOT ASSOCIATE WITH BOSTON. THE REALITY IS. EVERY DISTRICT IN THIS CITY, EACH ONE OF OUR DISTRICTS HAS PARCELS OF LAND THAT FALL INTO THIS. THIS IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE TREMENDOUS TOOLS TO THE CITY OF BOSTON AND IN PARTICULAR OUR CONVERSATION COMMISSION IN THINKING ABOUT OUR CLIMATE FUTURE. JUST AS THIS COUNCIL WORKED WITH THE ADMINISTRATION TO AUTHORIZE COMMUNITY CHOICE ENERGY AND TO GET THE BIGGEST, FASTEST STEP WE COULD TAKE TO TRANSITION TO RENEWABLE ENERGY, THIS WOULD BE THE FASTEST STEP WE COULD TAKE IN EMPOWERING OUR EFFORTS AROUND DEVELOPMENT IN THE CITY. WE'RE IN A BOOMING MARKET. AS WE'RE HAVING THIS **CONVERSATION WITH RESIDENTS** ABOUT HOW TO BALANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT WITH OPEN SPACE, WITH FLOODING REALITIES, WITH AFFORDABLE HOUSING, WE NEED TO HAVE MORE TOOLS IN OUR BASKET. BOSTON IS BEHIND IN THIS AREA AND NOT SEIZING THESE TOOLS THAT THE STATE MAKES AVAILABLE. WE'RE ONE OF THREE MASSACHUSETTS MUNICIPALITIES ALONG THE COAST THAT HAS NOT ADOPTED A LOCAL WETLANDS ORDINANCE.

THE ADMINISTRATION AND THE COUNCIL HAVE BEEN HAVING A CONVERSATION FOR MANY YEARS NOW ABOUT HOW BEST TO DO THIS FOR THE CITY.

CHIEF COOK HAS BEEN INCREDIBLE IN ENGAGING AND REACHED OUT JUST BEFORE WE FILED THIS TO SAY THAT HE'S LOOKING FORWARD TO MAKING SURE WE'RE SITTING DOWN WITH OUR COALITION AND ALL OF THE COLLEAGUES AND IN CRAFTING SOMETHING THAT WORKS FOR BOSTON. BUT THE BOTTOM LINE IS THAT WE

HAVE TO START MESHING ALL OF OUR ACTIONS WHEN IT COMES TO CLIMATE CHANGE.

WE CAN'T HAVE ONE SET OF PLANS AROUND RESILIENCY AND ANOTHER SET OF DECISION-MAKING CRITERIA FOR INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENTS THAT COME UP.

IT HAS TO BE ONE IN THE SAME AND **CONSERVATION COMMISSION IS** ALREADY DOING THAT WORK. THIS ORDINANCE, COUNCILLOR ZAKIM COMMENTED, THAT WE MIGHT HAVE USED A FEW MORE TREES IN PRINTING IT THAN WE SHOULD HAVE. IT'S VERY LONG, HAS LONG DEFINITIONS.

IT WOULD EXPAND THE PURVIEW OF THE CONVERSATION COMMISSION TO INCLUDE MORE AREA AS WELL AS CHANGE HOW THEY MAKE THEIR DECISIONS, TO ALLOW THEM TO CONSIDER CLIMATE CHANGE RESILIENCY.

SO WE'RE NOT TALKING ABOUT LAND THAT PHYSICALLY AFFECTS THE WETLANDS OR NEXT TO IT, ALTHOUGH THAT IS THE FIRST THROUGHOUT THE CITY, WE ARE TALKING ABOUT EVERY PLACE WHERE HAVING MORE OF A CONVERSATION ABOUT DEVELOPMENT COULD PROTECT AGAINST FUTURE FLOODING, COULD MAKE SURE THAT WE'RE BEST PREPARING OUR RESIDENTS HAVE A SUSTAINABLE AND LIVABLE FUTURE IN THE CITY. LASTLY, MOST IMPORTANTLY, I WANT TO THANK OUR COALITION OF ADVOCATES THAT HAVE COME TOGETHER FROM AROUND THE CITY. MANY PEOPLE ARE REPRESENTED IN THE CHAMBER TODAY. WE HAVE FOLKS AROUND HIDE PARK, JAMAICA PLAINS AND ROXBURY AND ALL OVER.

WE'RE LOOKING FORWARD TO HAVING THIS CONVERSATION AND PUTTING ONE MORE ACCOMPLISHMENT UNDER THIS COUNCIL'S BELT AND SAYING THAT WE STOOD UP THE BEST WE COULD TO CREATING A LIVABLE FUTURE FOR OUR KIDS AND TO COME AFTER THAT. THANK YOU.

I WANT TO THANK DAVID MORGAN, A POLICY FELLOW IN MY -- THE LEAD SPONSOR'S OFFICE THIS SUMMER THAT PUT SOME GREAT WORK IN THIS.

DRAFTED THIS REMARKABLE PIECE OF LEGISLATION.

WHEN WE TALK ABOUT SUSTAINABILITY, WHEN WE TALK ABOUT THE SINGLE GREATEST CULPRIT FOR GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, IT'S BUILDINGS.

WE HAVE THIS REALIZATION IN THE MIDST OF ONE OF THE LARGEST BUILDING BOOMS IN BOSTON HISTORY.

YESTERDAY THE CITY RECEIVED THE CARBON-FREE BOSTON REPORT AND THE FACT THAT MORE THAN 70% OF GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS COME FROM BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

WHEN WE TALK ABOUT BUILDING, THAT'S A WAY THAT WE CAN ADDRESS IT AND FIX IT AND GET TO WORK. THAT'S WHY I'M HONORED TO WORK WITH YOU ON NET ZERO CARBON. THE OTHER PART OF THAT COIN OR EQUATION WOULD BE ZONING AND USING TOOLS THAT WE HAVE AT OUR DISPOSAL AND WE HAVE NOT USED IN TERMS OF SUSTAINABILITY AND BUILDING.

WE GO BACK AND WE REASSESS PERSONAL PROPERTY ACROSS OUR CITY REGULARLY. WE NEED TO MAKE SURE WE DO THE SAME WHEN IT COMES TO NONPROFITS, HOSPITALS, EVERYBODY THAT IS DOING BUSINESS IN THIS CITY THAT IS NOT REQUIRED TO PAY TAXES ON THAT PROPERTY. THERE'S AN IMPORTANT NEED TO GET BACK TO THE TABLE IN THIS WORKING SESSION. SOMETHING THAT WAS ALLUDED TO EARLIER, IT'S BEEN ONGOING FOR DECADES IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. IT'S GREAT AND WONDERFUL THAT WE HAVE THESE INSTITUTIONS HERE THAT ARE EDUCATING PEOPLE, HELPING OUR ECONOMY, THAT ARE HELPING THE ECONOMIC GROWTH IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

DEPENDENT FOR PROPERTY TAXES. NEW YORK, SEATTLE, THEY'RE HALF AT BEST.

WE BELIEVE THAT POLICE AND FIREFIGHTERS DO A BETTERJOB WHEN THEY KNOW THE COMMUNITY, THE STREETS AND THE NEIGHBORHOODS, THIS HAS FULL SUPPORT FROM THE FIREFIGHTERS AND THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE MASSACHUSETTS ASSOCIATION OF

MINORITY LAW OFFICERS.

RULE IS BEING REFILED DUE TO A TECHNICAL WORDING SUGGESTION THAT CAME BACK FROM THE LEGISLATURE.

WHENEVER THERE'S A FIRE, I ALWAYS TRY TO REACH OUT TO THE FAMILIES TO ENSURE THAT THEY

KNOW THEIR RIGHTS AND WHAT RESOURCES ARE AVAILABLE TO THEM

AND OFFER MY SUPPORT.

I DO SO THROUGH THE LENS OF SOMEONE THAT HAS BEEN THERE. SO WHEN MY DAUGHTERS 3 YEARS

OLD, WE HAD A FIRE. A VERY SCARY EVENT.

WE WERE HOME AT THE TIME.

FORTUNATELY IT WAS DURING THE DAY.

MY MOM IN 2012 WAS DISPLACED.

ALL THREE FIRES THAT I'M

THINKING OF IN MY FAMILY WERE ALL DISPLACED.

ONLY IN MY MOM'S CASE WAS SHE ABLE TO MOVE BACK.

SO THERE'S A LOT OF THINGS THAT FAMILIES HAVE TO OR INDIVIDUALS HAVE TO DEAL WITH.

NOT JUST LOSS OF PROPERTY BUT

WHAT THEY'RE GOING TO DO NEXT.
THEY'RE MISSING TIME FROM WORK
TO DEAL WITH THESE ISSUES.
THERE ARE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH
TRYING TO MOVE.
IT'S JUST VERY TRAUMATIC AND
VERY OVERWHELMING.
I DO APPRECIATE THE WORK THAT

I DO APPRECIATE THE WORK THAT THE CITY IS DOING.
