

The Slow Streets program focuses on quick-install solutions to address pressing street safety concerns. Plans may include:

- Signs to alert drivers they are entering a residential area with a 20 mph speed limit
- Better crosswalks
- Speed humps to slow drivers
- Parking restrictions at some intersections so drivers can better see pedestrians and oncoming traffic when turning (referred to as "Daylighting")
- Changes to street direction or parking on narrow street
- Changes to design of curbs or medians to slow driving speeds and make streets safer for crossing
