AN ELEVATED CYBERSECURITY WITH LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE. LAUNCHED THE ACCESS BOSTON PORTAL AND THE NEW IDENTITY ACCESS MANAGEMENT SOLUTION. THIS IS A PROGRAM THAT ENABLES SECURE, RELIABLE, CONVENIENT SINGLE SIGN-ON ACCESS TO THE CITY OF BOSTON'S TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS. SHORT-TERM RENTAL REGISTRATION

A FEW OF THE HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE CONDUCT A DETAILED CYBERSECURITY ASSESSMENT ADDRESSING KNOWN GAPS, IDENTIFY NEW OPPORTUNITY AREAS, ASSIST WITH PROJECT PRIORITIZATION, AND ROAD MAPPING, DEVELOP A FORMAL CYBERSECURITY GOVERNANCE BOARD CONSISTING OF SENIOR TECHNOLOGY AND BUSINESS LEADERSHIP THROUGHOUT THE CITY OF BOSTON, ENHANCE THE IDENTITY AND ACCESS MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS THROUGH INTEGRATION WITH OTHER CITY AGENCIES AND APPLICATIONS, DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE DLP TO IDENTIFY, CLASSIFY, AND PROTECT SENSITIVE CITY DATA, MODERNIZE THE PERMITTING PLATFORM WITH ENHANCED FUNCTIONALITY AND MOBILE CAPABILITIES FOR THE CITY'S WORKFORCE, MODERNIZE OUR BASE ERP CAPITAL PLATFORM TO ENSURE SUSTAINABILITY OF THE CITY'S CORE PROCESSOR, BEGIN PHASE 1 OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF

THE VERIZON FIBER CONTRIBUTION TO THE CITY'S FIBER NETWORK BY

**CONNECTING 74 CITY FACILITIES** USING VERIZON STAR FIBER, BEGIN IMPLEMENTATION OF CROWN SERVICES AND LATERAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS TO FACILITATE CONNECTION OF 86 FACILITIES TO THE CITY'S FIBER NETWORK, IMPROVE DATA QUALITY BY LAYING A SOLID FOUNDATION THAT ENABLES US TO FULLY UNDERSTAND THE DATA WE'RE WORKING. THIS INCLUDES SUCH ITEMS AS A MASTER DATA IMPLEMENTATION SOLUTION TO CLARIFY AND MANAGE THE CITY'S MOST CRITICAL DATA. DEVELOP A BOARD FOCUSED ON THE INTEGRITY AND SECURITY OF DATA USED IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, AND DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE ROAD MAP AND TIMELINE TO MIGRATE MORE OF THE CITY'S PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE TO THE CLOUD. RESIDENTS IN ORDER TO HELP THEM

GET ONLINE, IN ORDER TO LEARN

HOW TO GET ONLINE.

THERE'S AN ONLINE LEARNING

READINESS PROGRAM, FOR INSTANCE.

IN ADDITION TO THAT, THE FIBER

PROJECT THAT I MENTIONED TO COUNCILOR JANEY THAT YOU SUPPORTED IN OCTOBER, WHEN WE PUT OUT A CONTRACT FOR 30 YEARS FOR NOW FIBER, THAT FIBER PROJECT IS GOING TO REACH EVERY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IN THE CITY. AND WHEN WE DO THAT, WE WILL HAVE ALL THE ADMINISTRATIVE NEEDS PER NETWORK, AND WE'LL INJECT WICKET FREE WI-FI INTO THE OPEN SPACES AND COMMUNITY ROOMS OF ALL OF THOSE CENTERS. MANY YEARS AGO, PUBLIC HOUSING HAD LOTS OF WI-FI. I THINK IT WAS ABOUT TEN YEARS AGO. IT WAS THE ARRA RECOVERY MONEY

THAT SUPPORTED IT.

AS THE MONEY WENT AWAY, THE ABILITY TO SORT OF SUSTAIN THAT ALSO WENT AWAY.

THERE WASN'T NEW MONEY FOR NEW EOUIPMENT AS THINGS GOT TIRED AND OLD, SO THIS WILL BE A REJUVENATION OF ACCESS FOR EVERYBODY WE HOPE IN PUBLIC HOUSING IN BOSTON.

>> I THINK THAT'S AN IMPORTANT ISSUE AS WE TALK ABOUT THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, MAKING SURE THAT OUR CHILDREN THAT ARE RESIDENTS OF PUBLIC HOUSING HAVE THAT SAME LEVEL OF ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES THROUGH THE INTERNET AS OTHER RESIDENTS OUTSIDE OF PUBLIC HOUSING. THAT WOULD BE A PRIORITY FOR ME, AND I'D LIKE FOR YOU GUYS TO STAY ON TOP OF THAT AND CONTINUE TO UPDATE ME AND THE COUNCIL AS WELL.

I DON'T EVEN THINK RESIDENTS OF PUBLIC HOUSING SHOULD BE PAYING FOR IT.

WE REALLY NEED TO ADDRESS THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP. AND THAT'S ONE SMALL WAY OF DOING THAT, SO WHATEVER I CAN DO TO BE HELPFUL, PLEASE LET ME KNOW. MY OTHER QUESTION HAD TO DO WITH -- CAN YOU TELL ME A LITTLE

BIT ABOUT THE CATHOLIC SQUARE

TENANT ORGANIZATION?
THEY RECEIVE FUNDING.
I WENT BY OUR FACILITY AND HAD
AN OPPORTUNITY TO TALK TO SOME
OF THE YOUNG PEOPLE THAT WORK
THERE AND SOME OF THE YOUNG
PEOPLE THAT STAY IN THE PROGRAM,
BUT ANY BACKGROUND ON THE
PROGRAM ITSELF AND HOW IT'S
GOING?

>> YES, IT WAS A DIGITAL EQUITY GRANT GIVEN TO CATHOLIC SCHOOL TENANTS ORGANIZATION LAST YEAR. I THINK IT IS NEAR COMPLETION. THERE WAS INITIALLY I THINK A \$35,000 GRANT.

WHAT SHOULD WE BE DOING?

ARE WE DOING THE BEST THAT WE

SHOULD BE DOING, I GUESS?

>> SO, CYBERSECURITY IN GENERAL,

IT'S A VERY LARGE TOPIC.

IN MY EXPERIENCE IN THE I.T.

SECTOR, WHAT'S BEEN MOST

SUCCESSFUL IS A VERY LAYERED

APPROACH BECAUSE THERE'S NOT ONE

SOLUTION THAT'S A PANACEA THAT'S

GOING TO SOLVE EVERYTHING.

IT REALLY STARTS DOWN TO, YES,

I'M SURE YOU SAW THE HEADLINES

OF WHAT HAPPENED IN BALTIMORE

THIS WEEK, SO THERE ARE THE

RANSOMWARE ATTACKS, BUT THERE'S

ALSO INTERNAL BREACHES.

BUT THERE'S ALSO SPEAR PHISHING

AND PHISHING ATTACKS, SO THERE'S

A LAUNDRY LIST OF

VULNERABILITIES THAT CAN HAPPEN.

WHAT THE APPROACH STARTS OFF

WITH IS INDIVIDUALS, USERS OF

THE PCs, AND MAKING SURE THAT

THEY ARE EDUCATED IN TERMS OF

THE HYGIENE THAT NEEDS TO BE IN

PLACE TO BE A SECURE

ENVIRONMENT.

THAT'S ONE OF THE THINGS I

TALKED ABOUT IN MY OPENING

REMARKS AROUND SECURITY WAS

CREATING THAT SECURITY CULTURE,

AND THAT'S REALLY WHERE IT

STARTS BECAUSE MOST OF THESE

BREACHES REALLY HAPPEN AT THE END USER LEVEL FROM INFORMATION BEING SHARED OUT. SO. WHERE WE'RE APPROACHING SORT

OF THE ACCESS BOSTON IS A

TWO-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION.

YOU NEED TWO FACTORS TO GET ON OUR SYSTEMS.

THAT'S ONE OF THE STEPS WE'RE

TAKING.

ALSO, LOOKING AT HOW TO PLATFORM

MONITORING, LOOKING AT THE

ENVIRONMENT, THE CONTINUED

SCANNING OF THE ENVIRONMENT TO

BE LOOKING FOR THREATS.

THERE'S A LOT I'M GOING TO BE

WORKING ON.

>> DO WE DO THAT INTERNALLY OR

DO WE CONTRACT WITH SOMEONE ELSE

TO DO THE MONITORING?

>> SO, THE WAY I'VE ALWAYS

APPROACHED SECURITY -- AND THIS

>> HOW IS INTERACTING WITH THE

**ELECTIONS COMMISSION?** 

I THINK THERE HAVE BEEN OVER THE

LAST FEW YEARS AN ATTEMPTS TO

GET INTO STATE VOTER

REGISTRATION FILES, I ASSUME

MUNICIPALITIES AS WELL AROUND

THE COUNTRY.

IS THAT A FOCUS OF OUR EFFORT?

THAT'S AN IMPORTANT ISSUE HEADED

INTO 2020 FOR SURE.

I DON'T KNOW HOW MUCH OF AN

INTEREST RUSSIANS HAVE IN OUR

CITY COUNCIL ELECTIONS UPCOMING, **BUT CERTAINLY IN 2020 WANT TO** MAKE SURE WE'RE PREPARED. >> SO, YES, THAT IS ABSOLUTELY SOMETHING WE'RE WORKING ON AT A CITY LEVEL AND STATE LEVEL. FROM WASHINGTON, D.C., THAT'S ON A NATIONAL LEVEL. AND WE'RE ALL TRYING TO GET IT RIGHT, AND THE CLOCK IS TICKING TO THE 2020 ELECTION. WE'RE ALL REALLY TRYING TO FOCUS ON HARDENING OUR ELECTION INFRASTRUCTURE. AND SOME STATES ARE BETTER OFF THAN OTHERS, BUT THAT'S DEFINITELY SOMETHING WE ARE FOCUSED ON TO PREPARE OURSELVES FOR THAT. >> GO AHEAD. >> DO WE SPECIFICALLY HAVE A GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE FORMED WITH **ELECTIONS ON EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT AND ARE PARTICIPATING IN ANY OF THE CONTRACTUAL DECISIONS WITH HARDWARE TO MAKE SURE SECURITY IS NUMBER ONE. ONE OF THE GREATER EQUALIZERS IS ACCESS TO TECHNOLOGY AND BEING ABLE TO ACCESS CITY RESOURCES THROUGH TECHNOLOGY IS HOW PEOPLE ARE ABLE TO ACCESS JOBS, SO MY LINE OF QUESTIONING HAS BEEN ANSWERED, BUT I WANT TO TALK ABOUT AREAS THAT I HOPE TO SEE AN INCREASE IN ACCESS. WE HAD A LOT OF CONVERSATION ABOUT MARIJUANA EQUITY AND CONCERNS ABOUT THAT. ONE OF THE THINGS YOU DID EXTREMELY WELL IS WHEN IT CAME TO CONTRACTING. THERE WAS THE MAP OF PROPERTY FOR CONTRACT, THE RFP. YOU CAN SEE WHERE ALL THAT'S HAPPENING. IT'S EXCEPTIONAL. I BROUGHT IT UP TO OFFICE OF EMERGING INDUSTRIES, AND I HOPE THEY'RE GOING TO HAVE A MAP THAT SHOW WHERE THE APPLICATIONS ARE FOR CANNABIS STORES OR CANNABIS PRODUCTS, WHERE THEY ARE IN THE PIPELINE, IF THEY'VE BEEN GRANTED, IF THEY'VE GOTTEN A

HOST COMMUNITY AGREEMENT SO THAT COMMUNITIES CAN MONITOR FROM A 30,000-FOOT VIEW OF WHAT'S GOING ON BUT ALSO FROM THE COMPANIES.

ACCESS AND TECHNOLOGY ARE PIPELINES THAT WE WANT TO CREATE -- THE REPORTS ARE OUT THERE AND THE COMMENTS ARE OUT THERE ABOUT HOW WE DON'T HAVE A LOT OF CITY CONTRACTS GOING TO PEOPLE OF COLOR AND WOMEN. HAVING SEEN AND TRIED TO GUIDE SOMEONE THROUGH THE CONTRACTING PROCESS, I WAS OVERWHELMED BY IT, BUT WHAT COULD HELP IS WORKING WITH THE AGENCIES TO MAKE SURE THE PORTAL IS MORE STREAMLINED, BUT MAYBE UNIVERSAL APPLICATION FOR CERTAIN KIND OF CONTRACTS.
