COLLECTIVE BARGAINING RESERVE FOR CONTRACTS NEXT YEAR FOLLOWING RECYCLING SERVICES AND ADDITIONAL \$4.8 MILLION FOR THE CRITICAL CITY SERVICES. \$150,000 HAS BEEN ADDED TO THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT TO SUPPORT THE FORENSIC UNIT IN ORDER TO BETTER ANALYZE IN DISCUSSION WITH COUNCILORS WE'RE ADDING \$60.000 TO THE BOSTON POLICE DEPARTMENT TO FUND A TRANSPORTATION CRASH ANALYST AND EXPANDING METRO ACCESS TO BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND \$92,000 ADDED TO THE BOSTON PUBLIC LIBRARIES TO MAINTAIN FACILITY SERVICES AN \$55.000 TO IMPROVE OUTREACH FOR THE IMMIGRANT ADVANCEMENT. I'LL TAKE ONE STEP OUT OF THE WEEDS FOR A SECOND AND PULL UP TO A HIGH LEVEL TO GIVE YOU THE PARAMETERS OF THE \$3.4 BILLION MEANS. WE HAVE IDENTIFIED ADDITIONAL \$10.2 MILLION IN NEW REVENUE OR .25% AND THIS MOVES THE GENERAL FUND UP TO \$3.49 BILLION AND THE LARGE CATEGORIES REMAIN LARGELY THE SAME AND PROPERTY GROWTH IS OWN 70% OF REVENUE AND LOCAL REVENUE IS TARGETED AND WE ARE PROJECTING \$12 MILLION REDUCTION FOR NEXT YEAR WILL CONTINUE. MOVING ON TO SOME HIGH-LEVEL SPENDING. THE OVERALL SPENDING LEVEL REFLECT THE \$3.49 BILLION. WHILE THE RESUBMITTED BUDGET CONTAINS \$10 MILLION IN NEW FUNDING THE LARGEST BITE CONTINUES TO BE PUBLIC EDUCATION.

WE SPEND ABOUT 20% ON PUBLIC SAFETY, 17% ON OTHER CITY DEPARTMENTS, 15% ON FIXED COSTS LIKE PENSION AND DEBT SERVICE CONSISTENT WITH WHAT WE HAVE BEEN PLANNING FOR AND SPEND ABOUT 8% ON HEALTH CARE. MORE THAN THE OVERALL NUMBER IS

I WANTED TO HIGHLIGHT SOME OF THE MAJOR INVESTMENTS INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET THAT EMMA TOUCHED ON AND WE WANT TO MAKE SURE FOLKS REALIZE THE EXCITING STUFF GOING ON IN THE BUDGET. **INCLUDES \$15 MILLION FOR THE** QUALITY PRE-K FUND TO SUPPORT THE MIXED DELIVERY SYSTEM WITH SCHOOL-BASED PROGRAMS AND COMMUNITY-BASED CENTERS THAT **GUARANTEED EVERY 4-YEAR-OLD IN** BOSTON A HIGH-QUALITY PRE-K. WE ADDED OVER 50 SEATS AND THIS \$15 MILLION WILL GET US TO CLOSE THE SEAT GAP IDENTIFIED AND WE **INCLUDE \$5 MILLION IN NEW** REVENUE TO END CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS AND REVENUE FOR WALKABLE STREETS AND DEDICATED BUS LANES AND MAJOR BIKE CORRIDORS AND INVEST IN PUBLIC PLAZAS TO REVITALIZED UNDER UTILIZED SPACE IN THE CITY. IN ADDITION TO HOPELESSNESS INVESTMENTS WE'RE SUPPORTING AFFORDABLE HOUSING CREATION LIKE THE ADU PROGRAM AND RENTAL COURT IN CITY OF BOSTON THE BUDGET WILL GO UP 45% NEXT YEAR SO IT'S AN EXCITING INVESTMENT WE'RE EXCITED ABOUT AND WE'RE THRILLED TO ANNOUNCE MAJOR NEW FUNDING FOR ART AND LIBRARIES. INCLUDED IN THIS IS \$400,000 TO EXPAND PRINT AND COLLECTION RESOURCES AND \$140,000 FOR NEW LIBRARIES AND \$350,000 IN SUPPORT FOR LIBRARIES. ON THE ART SIDE WE HAVE NEW ANNUAL GRANTS FOR THE ART PROGRAM AND INDIVIDUAL ART GRANT PROGRAM AND STAFF TO MAKE SURE ARTISTS ARE CONNECTING WITH RESOURCES. EMS STAFF TO RECRUIT DIVERSE

CANDIDATES AND REMOVE FINANCIAL BARRIERS AND FUND FORG THE -FUNDING FOR THE FIRE CADET AND THE LEADERSHIP AND EXECUTIVE ORDER AND INCLUDES HEALTH AND SAFETY AND COMMUNITY INVESTMENTS ACROSS THE PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENTS LIKE POLICE, FIRE AND EMS.

WE HAVE NEW ANTI-VIOLENCE STAFF AND INTERVENTION FUNDING THROUGH BPD AND BHHC AND TRAUMA RESPONSE TEAMS AND 24-HOUR TRAUMA HOT LINE AND IT INCLUDES NEW FUNDING FOR BOSTON FOR CLIMATE CHANGE AND TO MAINTAIN OUR OPEN SPACE INCLUDING ZERO WASTE INITIATIVES ACROSS THE CITY.

BUILDING ENERGY INVESTMENTS AND TREE CANOPY WORK AND MORE PARK RANGERS AND I THINK THERE'S A LOT OF GOOD STUFF IN THE BUDGET WE CAN ALL BE PROUD OF. OUTSIDE OF THE OPERATING BUDGET I WANT TO QUICKLY MENTION THE CAPITAL PLAN WHICH IS ALSO A KEY PART OF THE CITY'S PLAN FOR INVESTMENT FOR NEXT YEAR. AND SO I THINK THE ESTIMATE ON THE FIRST ROUND OF TRAINING IS SOMETHING LIKE 100 CITY LEADERS, A COUPLE FOLKS FROM EACH DEPARTMENT CITY WIDE WHO WE WOULD THEN SORT OF AT THE TAIL END OF THE PROCUREMENT WOULD HELP START ADVISING US ON HOW TO THEN ROLL THAT OUT MORE DEEPLY THROUGH EACH DEPARTMENT. >> DO YOU HAVE A CERTAIN NUMBER OF DEPARTMENTS IN MIND" v? WE GET A LOT OF E-MAILS, A LOT

I THINK THE FIRST THING TO NOTE

I THINK THE FIRST THING TO NOTE IS THE VAST MAJORITY OF EVEN THE CITY PROCUREMENT FOR I.T. SERVICES IS DONE AND WE DON'T BUDGET FOR A B.P.D. SYSTEM AND WE HAVE A CAPITAL PLAN IT'S USUALLY A BIGGER ONE SO WE'D BE HAPPY TO CONTINUE THE DISCUSSION AND HELP YOU RE-ENGAGE IN DOING IT IN THE R.F.P. TO GET THAT UP THERE AND WOULDN'T NECESSARILY BUDGET FOR SOMETHING DISCREETLY IN THE BUDGET TO FUND THAT TYPE OF INVESTMENT.

>> AND I'D LIKE TO PUSH BACK AS
WE ATTEMPTED THAT.
COUNCILLOR PRESIDENT THIS WAS AT

THIS MY SECOND BUDGET AND I'M CERTAIN THIS PROCESS HAS BEEN MADE EASIER BECAUSE OF HIS LEADERSHIP. MANY THANKS, COUNCILOR CIOMMO. THIS IS YOUR FINAL BUDGET BUT MY SECOND BUDGET. SO LAST YEAR'S BUDGET INCLUDED A NEW POSITION THAT IS OBVIOUSLY

INCLUDED AGAIN THIS YEAR. THIS IS BASICALLY SOFTWARE LICENSES AN EQUIPMENT.

- >> WHAT ABOUT ON THE HOUSING FRONT?

WHAT KIND OF INVESTMENTS ARE WE USING AND HOW ARE WE TAPPING INTO THE LUXURY HOUSING GOING UP WHETHER THROUGH PROPERTY TAX REVENUE OR LOOKING AT I.D.P. HOW WILL WE MAKE SURE WE'RE BUILDING MORE HOUSING FOR THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF BOSTON WHO NEED IT AND NOT THE HIGH END BUT THE STUFF IN THE MIDDLE WHERE MANY OF RESIDENTS WHO DON'T QUALIFY FOR SUBSIDY BUT DON'T EARN ENOUGH FOR THE HIGH END MARKET RATE. WE ARE NOT AT THE CAP NOW. **OUR CAPITAL PLAN ENVISIONS US** BEING AT THE CAPITAL BUT IT IS ONE OF THE WAYS IN WHICH GROWTH AND PROPERTY TAX REVENUE SEES CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION AS IT INCREASES THE 7% INCREASES. I THINK THAT'S IMPORTANT. AND WE DO SO MUCH OF OUR CREATION THROUGH THINGS LIKE THE HOUSING TRUST AND LINKAGE AND B.P.A. PROBABLY GET SOME OF THIS IN OUR HANDS TOMORROW BUT IN TERMS OF PREVENTION AND INVESTMENT CAN YOU SPEAK TO THAT HOW MUCH OF THE BUDGET IS GOING TOWARDS VIOLENCE PREVENTION? >> IT'S HARD TO SAY EXACTLY HOW MUCH BUT IT'S A DIFFERENT GROUP OF DEPARTMENTS. ONE THING WE DIDN'T SPEND A LOT OF TIME TALKING ABOUT WAS THE PROGRAM AND BCYF DID A REVAMP OF THE PROGRAM AND \$60,000 IN THE FY20 TO REVAMP A STREET WORKER PROGRAM AND CHIEF MARTINEZ AND COMMISSIONER MORALES HAVE BEEN WORKING HARD ON GETTING THE PROGRAM UP AND RUNNING. WE HAVE VIOLENCE INTERVENTION FUNDING AT B.P.D. AND FUNDING TO RESPOND TO TRAUMA. WE HAVE SIX NEIGHBORHOOD TRAUMA TEAMS FUNDED IN THE BUDGET AND WE HAVE THE HOT LINE. WE ARE CONTINUING TO TRY TO DO AS MUCH AS WE CAN TO WORK ON VIOLENCE ESPECIALLY YOUTH VIOLENCE AND BECAUSE IT TOUCHES SO MANY DEPARTMENTS IT NEEDS A **BIG INVESTMENT AND THERE'S** INVESTMENTS IN A VARIETY OF DEPARTMENTS. >> ANY SPECIFIC DOLLAR AMOUNTS

OR PERCENTAGES YOU CAN QUOTE AROUND PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION?

>> YES. SO CHIEF MARTINEZ PUT TOGETHER A COUPLE LETTERS TO THE COUNCIL TO ARTICULATE ALL THE **DIFFERENT INVESTMENTS IN FY20** THAT ARE CENTERED ON YOUTH VIOLENCE.

WE HAVEN'T TOTALLED IT IT SPANS SEVERAL DEPARTMENTS INCLUDING D.Y.E. AND THERE'S 8.5% INVESTMENT BEYOND THE RESOURCES ALREADY DEDICATED TO THAT PROGRAM IN ADDITION TO THE ONGOING PROGRAMS WITH NON-PROFITS THIS SUMMER WHICH ARE CAMPS THEY RUN AND ADDITIONAL CAPACITY IN FY20 FOR DCYF. WE INVESTMENTS IN D.Y.E. TO

CONTINUE THE WORK OF SUMMER JOBS AND YOUTH JOBS WITH A 7% INCREASE IN FY20 FOR D.Y.E. AND THE FUNDING WILL CONTINUE TO FUND SUMMER JOBS AND 500 FULL-YEAR JOBS.
WE SPENT \$1.3 MILLION TO FUND THE NEIGHBORHOOD TRAUMA TEAM

NETWORK.
>> HOW'S THAT COMPARE TO LAST
YEAR THOUGH?

>> THOSE ARE THE SAME
NEIGHBORHOOD TRAUMA TEAMS AS
LAST YEAR SO ANY COSTS UP HAVE
ARE ASSOCIATE WITH THE YEARLY
COST INCREASES.

>> THE INVESTMENT FROM THIS YEAR'S BUDGET IS AROUND JUST THE GROWTH THAT WOULD HAPPEN ORDINARILY IT'S NOT AN INCREASE TO DO MORE.

>> FOR NEIGHBORHOOD TRAUMA TEAMS, YES.

IN OTHER PLACES IT'S AN INVESTMENT AND NEW INVESTMENTS AT B.P.D. BUT THE UNDERLYING INVESTMENT FROM PRIOR YEAR BUDGETS ARE PART OF THE PICTURE IN HOW THE CITY THINKS ABOUT THESE THINGS AND YOU ALL WILL BE TALKING ABOUT TOMORROW.

>> AND FINALLY, WE DON'T HAVE TO GET IN DETAILS BUT MY EQUITY ORDINANCE CALLS FOR A FIND.
THERE'S A COMMITMENT TO FUND THE FUND FROM THE ADMINISTRATION IT FROM THE MAYOR'S OFFICE, YES?
IF YOU COULD STATE THAT AFFIRMATIVELY FOR THE RECORD.

>> I KNOW THERE'S CONVERSATIONS HAPPENING.

I'VE NOT BEEN PART OF THE CONVERSATIONS WITH YOU BUT I'M HAPPY TO GET INVOLVED WITH THOSE.

COUNCILOR CIOMMO AND THANK YOU FOR GIVING ME THE OPPORTUNITY FOR ANOTHER ROUND OF QUESTIONS. I'LL BE BRIEF.

I JUST HAVE ONE QUESTION ON STATE AID.

IF STATE AID CONTINUES TO DECREASE NEXT YEAR AND THE YEAR AFTER, WHAT TYPE OF IMPACT WILL THAT HAVE ON CITY SERVICES AND MORE IMPORTANTLY ON CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS?

>> SO I THINK AN IMPORTANT SORT OF PIECE IS THE SIZE OF OUR INVESTMENTS IN THIS YEAR'S BUDGET.

JUSTIN MENTIONED THE GOVERNOR'S BUDGET INCLUDES A \$12 MILLION REDUCTION TO OUR BUDGET THIS YEAR.

IF YOU THINK ABOUT THAT IN TERMS

OF SIZE AND SCALE, THAT'S MORE THAN TWICE WHAT WE'RE ABLE TO **INVEST IN IN HOMELESS SERVICES** AND THE SIZE OF OUR UNIVERSAL PRE-K INVESTMENT AND YEAR OVER YEAR THE INVESTMENT STARTS TO HAVE A REAL IMPACT ON THE CITY AND WHAT WE'RE PARTICULARLY CONCERNED ABOUT, OBVIOUSLY, IS WHEN THE SORT OF CYCLE STARTS TO TURN AND WE AREN'T EXPERIENCING THINGS LIKE NEW GROWTH AND THINGS LIKE THAT. I THINK THERE'S BEEN AN OPERATING IMPACT AND THEN THERE'S THE CAPITAL IMPACT. THE CAPITAL BUDGET IS DIRECTLY DRIVEN BY THE SIZE OF OUR TAX REVENUE BECAUSE IT'S AROUND THE 7% OF AFFORDABLE CONSTRUCT. SO AS RESOURCES ARE CONSTRAINED BY STATE AID CONTRIBUTION IT WILL ULTIMATELY IMPACT OUR CAPITAL BUDGET AND \$12 MILLION IS THE SIZE OF OUR STREETS INVESTMENT THIS YEAR. YOU CAN CERTAINLY SEE AND IMAGINE WHAT IT WOULD BE LIKE FOR US TO NOT BE ABLE TO DO SOMETHING LIKE THAT. THE REALITY OF THE IMPACT WOULD PROBABLY BE A LITTLE BIT MORE SPREAD. WE'RE GOING TRY TO CONTINUE TO MOVE FORWARD AN ALL THE THINGS WE AGREE ARE ESSENTIAL THE COUNCIL HAS ADVOCATED FOR AND THE MAYOR CARES A LOT ABOUT BUT \$12 MILLION IS NOT INSIGNIFICANT. AND IF WE ARE TO CONTINUE ON THE TRAJECTORY IN TERMS OF HOW THE STATE FUNDS EDUCATION IN BOSTON WE'LL CERTAINLY FEEL THAT IMPACT AND IT WILL BE RELATIVELY SOON. >> AND AS A FOLLOW-UP I KNOW YOU HIGHLIGHTED STATE AID AND YOU BRIEFLY MENTIONED IF THERE IS A DOWNTURN IN THE ECONOMY ESPECIALLY WITHIN THE REAL ESTATE COMMUNITY AND WE DO SEE A SELLING DOWN OF CONSTRUCTION --SLOWING DOWN OF CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS IMPACTING PROPERTY

TAXES, ARE YOU FACTORING IN THAT NOW AS YOU'RE THINKING ABOUT NEXT YEAR'S BUDGET AND THE FOLLOWING BUDGET AND THINKING ABOUT WHAT THE DOWNTURN IN THE ECONOMY WILL HAVE A NEGATIVE IMPACT ON BOSTON AND HOW WILL IT HAVE AN IMPACT ON THE BUDGET AND CAPITAL AS WELL.

EVERY INVESTMENT WE MAKE HAS
BEEN THE MINDSET OF GETTING THE
CITY TO VISION ZERO.

ALL OF OUR INVESTMENTS IN BIKE LANES, STREETS, ROADWAY RECONSTRUCTION, INTERSECTION DESIGN ARE IN THE VEIN OF VISION ZERO.

IF NOT ALL OF THAT 27% COULD BE DEEMED VISION ZERO AND ALSO THE \$100 MILLION PLUS BUDGET BETWEEN BPD AND PUBLIC WORKS IS ALL TO SUPPORT THE VISION ZERO PLAN. >> OKAY.

>> SO MY UNDERSTANDING IS A WORKER UNDER THIS CONTRACT WILL GET 20% OF THEIR PAYCHECK, WILL BE A PREVAILING WAGE RATE. THE OTHER 80% WILL NOT.

>> YES.

>> SO IS THAT THE BEST THAT WE COULD GET FOR THESE WORKERS? >> I THINK IF IT BECOMES AN ISSUE OF HOW WE PAY, WHICH IS BY TONNAGE AND HOW THAT TRANSLATES TO WORKERS.

PAY FOR PREVAILING WAGES, I
