**ORDERED:**

I. That to meet the current expenses of the City of Boston, in the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2016 and ending June 30, 2017, the respective sums of money specified in the schedules hereinafter set out, be, and the same hereby are, appropriated for expenditure under the direction of the respective boards and officers severally specified, for the several specific purposes hereinafter designated and, except for transfers lawfully made, for such purposes only said appropriations, to the extent they are for the maintenance and operation of parking meters, and the regulation of parking and other activities incident thereto (which is hereby determined to be \$22,500,000), being made out of the income from parking meters and, to the extent they are for other purposes, being made out of the proceeds from the sale of tax title possessions and receipts from tax title redemptions in addition to the total real and personal property taxes of prior years collected from July 1, 2015 up to and including March 31, 2016, as certified by the City Auditor under Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws, and out of available funds on hand, (which is hereby determined to be \$40,000,000) as certified by the Director of Accounts under said Section 23, and the balance of said appropriations to be raised by taxation pursuant to Section 23 of Chapter 59 of the General Laws:



TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith an appropriation order for the Boston Public Schools (BPS) for Fiscal Year 2017, in the amount of \$1.032 billion, submitted pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224 of the Acts of 1936, as amended by Chapter 190 of the Acts of 1982, as further amended by Chapter 701 of the Acts of 1986, Chapter 613 of the Acts of 1987, and Chapter 108 of the Acts of 1991.

In this year's resubmission, I propose to increase our planned investment in Boston Public Schools by nearly \$5 million over my original recommendation, using resources we have identified as the revenue picture has gotten clearer over the months-long budget process. With this additional funding, BPS will invest in initiatives aimed at short-term progress and the long-term success of Boston's schools. This represents a total increase of \$18.2 million over FY16, and our spending on BPS is likely to grow when we reach a new contract agreement with our teachers. With your approval of this budget, together we will have increased BPS's annual budget by \$94 million since I took office.

I believe deeply in public education, and I believe our unstinting goals in public education should be to close opportunity and achievement gaps, meet the diverse needs of every kind of student, and make our district schools top choices for every family in every neighborhood. I believe the investments in this budget put us on a path to success.

This budget increases access to quality early childhood education by expanding Boston Public Schools' K1 programming by another 200 seats, building on the 200 new K1 seats added in the BPS budget over the last two years.

We are investing in equity – the Superintendent's new Excellence for All program will offer 4th graders in 13 schools access to rigorous and enriched experiences, bringing the benefits of the Advanced Work Classes to a more diverse set of students and equipping them with new skills such as foreign languages and robotics.

The BPS Budget also invests in special education with support teams, a new data system to give parents access to their students' individualized education plans, and transition services for students as they prepare to move on from BPS.

We are using data and performance accountability to address structural issues in BPS's budget, like the cost of transportation, to allow them to devote more dollars to the classroom in the long-run.

And the Superintendent will plan for BPS's future with instructional and logistical support for approximately 40 schools in advance of extended learning time roll out in FY18, grants to three schools to design a financially viable dual language program, and completion of the high school redesign.

Together, we are challenged to get transformative new initiatives off the ground while undertaking structural reforms that in some cases could take years to unlock savings. I ask for your support of a multi-faceted approach - through State

House advocacy; collective bargaining; long-term financial planning; a 10-year building plan; and central office reforms - to set the Boston Public Schools on a strong and sustainable course.

I respectfully request your support of the FY17 appropriation for the Boston Public Schools.



Dear Councilors:

I retransmit herewith for your approval an order appropriating \$40,000,000 to the Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) Liability Trust Fund authorized under Chapter 32B, §20, as added by Chapter 479 of the Acts of 2008. The OPEB actuarial valuation as of June 30, 2015 estimated the City's unfunded liability at \$2.26 billion, funded at approximately 13%. FY17's appropriation will bring the total aggregate amount contributed toward the City's and the Public Health Commission's unfunded liability to \$349 million.

While the City's successful partnership with its unions has been instrumental in controlling annual health care costs, trends beyond the City's influence continue to drive rates, as demonstrated by the recent increase in pharmaceutical costs. We remain committed to work together with the Public Employee Committee (PEC) to pursue strategies in order to mitigate these health care cost drivers, while continuing to provide quality health benefits both now and in the future.

Stabilizing and sustaining healthcare benefits for current and future retirees within the means of the City's budget is our shared goal and I thank you for your continued support.

These funds will support engineering and design services related to the bridge as well as interim and long-term measures that will be determined as a result of the current public and regulatory process. The funds shall be credited to the Capital Grant Fund from the Parking Meter Fund.

I urge your Honorable Body to adopt this Order as soon as possible so that the City of Boston may use the funds to proceed with the above-mentioned project.
